- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. Section 8.1 of the act of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633,
- 10 No.181), known as the Regulatory Review Act, reenacted and
- 11 amended June 30, 1989 (P.L.73, No.19) and amended December 6,
- 2002 (P.L.1227, No.148), is amended to read: 12
- 13 Section 8.1. Existing regulations.
- 14 The commission, on its motion or at the request of any person
- 15 or member of the General Assembly, may review any existing
- 16 regulation which has been in effect for at least [three] two
- 17 years. If a committee of the Senate or the House of
- 18 Representatives requests a review of an existing regulation, the
- commission shall perform the review and shall assign it high 19

- 1 priority. The commission may submit recommendations to an agency
- 2 recommending changes in existing regulations if it finds the
- 3 existing regulations to be contrary to the public interest under
- 4 the criteria established in section 5.2. The commission may also
- 5 make recommendations to the General Assembly and the Governor
- 6 for statutory changes if the commission finds that any existing
- 7 regulation may be contrary to the public interest.
- 8 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
