AN ACT

1 Designating a bridge carrying State Route 94 over Bermudian
2 Creek in Latimore Township, Adams County, as the Sgt. Michael
3 C. Weigand Memorial Bridge.

4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5 hereby enacts as follows:

6 Section 1. Sgt. Michael C. Weigand Memorial Bridge.

7 (a) Declaration of policy.--The General Assembly finds and
8 declares as follows:

9 (1) Sergeant Michael C. Weigand graduated from Bermudian
10 Springs High School in 2002.

11 (2) After graduating high school Sergeant Weigand
12 attended the Allegheny County Police Academy and graduated in
13 2003.

14 (3) Sergeant Weigand joined the York Springs/Latimore
15 Township Regional Police Department and Littlestown Police

Department.

(4) Sergeant Weigand went back to school to become a D.A.R.E. officer for Bermudian Springs School District.

(5) Sergeant Weigand was later promoted to sergeant at the Latimore Township Police Department, where his father is chief.

(6) On September 14, 2008, while on duty escorting a charity event, Sergeant Weigand was killed by a pickup truck which was out of control.

(7) Sergeant Weigand is survived by his wife, Amanda; daughter, Lanie; parents, Michael and Kimberly Weigand; and two sisters, Melanie Karpinski and Erin Jo Bevenour.

(b) Designation.--The bridge that carries State Route 94 over Bermudian Creek in Latimore Township, Adams County, is designated as the Sgt. Michael C. Weigand Memorial Bridge.

(c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs to indicate the designation under subsection (b).

Section 2. Effective date.

This act shall take effect in 60 days.
