AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 30 (Fish) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- Statutes, further providing for classification of offenses
- and penalties and for revocation, suspension or denial of
- license, permit or registration; and providing for serious
- 5 poaching incidents and for taking or possessing by illegal
- 6 methods.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. Section 923(a)(1), (2) and (3) and (b) of Title
- 10 30 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended and the
- 11 section is amended by adding a subsection to read:
- 12 § 923. Classification of offenses and penalties.
- 13 (a) General rule. -- The following penalties shall be imposed
- 14 for violations of this title:
- 15 (1) For a summary offense of the first degree, a fine of
- 16 [\$200] \$250 or imprisonment not exceeding 90 days.

- 1 (2) For a summary offense of the second degree, a fine
- of [\$100] \$150 or imprisonment not exceeding 20 days.
- 3 (3) For a summary offense of the third degree, a fine of
- 4 [\$50] <u>\$75</u>.
- 5 * * *
- 6 (b) Additional fine. -- In addition to the penalties in
- 7 subsection (a), a fine of [\$20] not less than \$20 nor more than
- 8 \$50 may be imposed for each fish taken, caught, killed,
- 9 possessed or sold in violation of this title or for each illegal
- 10 device used by an angler while in the act of fishing. In
- 11 computing the number of fish taken, caught, killed, possessed or
- 12 sold, the number immediately returned unharmed to the water
- 13 where they were taken shall be omitted.
- 14 * * *
- 15 (c.1) Additional penalty for serious poaching incidents.--In
- 16 <u>addition to the penalties in subsections (a) and (b), a person</u>
- 17 convicted or acknowledging guilt of violating section 2109
- 18 (relating to serious poaching incidents) or 2110 (relating to
- 19 taking or possessing by illegal methods) shall be assessed the
- 20 costs incurred by the commission for the replacement of the
- 21 species involved in the violation in an amount determined by
- 22 <u>regulation of the commission. Replacement costs may only be</u>
- 23 assessed for violations relating to threatened or endangered
- 24 species and any other species of fish designated by the
- 25 commission.

- 27 Section 2. Section 928(a), (b) and (d) of Title 30 are
- 28 amended to read:
- 29 § 928. Revocation, suspension or denial of license, permit or
- 30 registration.

- 1 (a) Revocation or denial. -- Any fishing license, special
- 2 license or permit or privilege, including boating privileges,
- 3 granted under the authority of this title may be revoked by the
- 4 commission, in its discretion, when the holder of the license,
- 5 permit or privilege is convicted of or pleads quilty to an
- 6 offense under this title. Further, the commission, in its
- 7 discretion, may refuse to grant to that person any new fishing
- 8 license, special license or permit or privilege for a period not
- 9 exceeding [two] <u>five</u> years.
- 10 (b) Suspension. -- The commission shall for a period of one
- 11 year suspend the privilege of operating a watercraft on the
- 12 waters of this Commonwealth of any individual who is convicted
- 13 of a violation of section 5502 (relating to operating watercraft
- 14 under influence of alcohol or controlled substance) or 5502.1
- 15 (relating to homicide by watercraft while operating under
- 16 influence) or [an adjudication of delinquency] <u>is adjudicated</u>
- 17 <u>delinquent</u> based on section 5502 or 5502.1. <u>If an individual is</u>
- 18 <u>imprisoned for violating section 5502 or 5502.1</u>, the period of
- 19 <u>suspension imposed under this subsection may not commence until</u>
- 20 the date of the individual's release from prison.
- 21 * * *
- 22 (d) Penalty.--A person commits a [summary offense of the
- 23 first degree] <u>misdemeanor of the third degree</u> if he performs an
- 24 act for which a fishing license, special license, permit or boat
- 25 registration is required or exercises a privilege, including the
- 26 privilege to operate a watercraft on the waters of this
- 27 Commonwealth, while the license, permit or privilege is
- 28 suspended or revoked. A person commits a misdemeanor of the
- 29 [third] second degree if he commits a second or subsequent
- 30 violation of a suspension or revocation during its term.

- 2 Section 3. Title 30 is amended by adding sections to read:
- 3 § 2109. Serious poaching incidents.
- 4 (a) Prohibited conduct. -- It shall be unlawful to do any of
- 5 the following from any waters of this Commonwealth, boundary
- 6 waters or lands:
- 7 (1) During the closed season, take, catch, kill or
- 8 possess fish having a replacement cost in excess of \$500.
- 9 (2) Take, catch, kill or possess three or more times the
- 10 <u>daily limit of fish.</u>
- 11 (b) Grading. -- Any person violating subsection (a) commits a
- 12 <u>misdemeanor of the second degree.</u>
- 13 § 2110. Taking or possessing by illegal methods.
- 14 (a) Prohibited conduct. -- It shall be unlawful to take,
- 15 catch, kill or possess fish by illegal methods, including seines
- 16 or gill nets, explosives, chemicals, spears, gigs, pitch forks,
- 17 bats or other devices not normally used for fishing, from any
- 18 waters of this Commonwealth, boundary waters or lands.
- 19 (b) Grading. -- The following shall apply:
- 20 (1) Any person violating subsection (a) relating to a
- 21 <u>single fish commits a summary offense of the second degree.</u>
- 22 (2) Any person violating subsection (a) relating to two
- or more fish, up to and including the legal daily limit,
- commits a summary offense of the first degree.
- 25 (3) Any person violating subsection (a) relating to more
- than the legal daily limit of fish, or a second or subsequent
- violation of subsection (a), commits a misdemeanor of the
- 28 second degree.
- 29 Section 4. The amendment or addition of the following
- 30 provisions shall apply to violations occurring on or after the

- 1 effective date of this section:
- 2 (1) 30 Pa.C.S. § 923(a)(1), (2) and (3), (b) and (c.1).
- 3 (2) 30 Pa.C.S. § 928(a), (b) and (d).
- 4 (3) 30 Pa.C.S. § 2109.
- 5 (4) 30 Pa.C.S. § 2110.
- 6 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
