1 2 3	Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further providing for definitions and for width of vehicles.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. The definition of "implement of husbandry" in
7	section 102 of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
8	Statutes is amended and the section is amended by adding
9	definitions to read:
10	§ 102. Definitions.
11	Subject to additional definitions contained in subsequent
12	provisions of this title which are applicable to specific
13	provisions of this title, the following words and phrases when
14	used in this title shall have, unless the context clearly-
15	indicates otherwise, the meanings given to them in this section:

2	"Agricultural commodity." Any of the following:
3	(1) Agricultural, apicultural, aquacultural,
4	horticultural, floricultural, viticultural and dairy
5	products.
6	(2) Livestock, poultry and the products of livestock and
7	poultry.
8	(3) Crops and crop by products.
9	(4) Nutrients.
10	* * *
11	"Crop." The term includes, but is not limited to:
12	(1) Field crops, including corn, wheat, oats, rye,
13	barley, hay, potatoes and dry beans.
14	(2) Fruits, including apples, peaches, grapes, cherries
15	and berries.
16	(3) Vegetables, including tomatoes, snap beans, cabbage,
17	carrots, beets, onions and mushrooms.
18	(4) Horticultural specialties, including nursery stock,
19	ornamental shrubs, ornamental trees and flowers.

21	"Implement of husbandry." Farm equipment that meets all of
22	the following criteria:
23	(1) Is equipped with pneumatic tires except if
24	prohibited by religious beliefs.
25	(2) Is infrequently operated or moved upon highways.
26	(3) Is used in agriculture for any of the following
27	purposes:
28	(i) performance of agriculture production or
29	harvesting activities for the farmer's agricultural
30	operations; or

1	(ii) transportation of <u>an</u> agricultural [products]
2	<u>commodity</u> or agricultural supplies for the benefit of the
3	farmer's agricultural operations.
4	The term also includes earthmoving equipment and any other-
5	vehicle determined by the department to be an implement of
6	husbandry.

8	<u>"Livestock." Cattle, horses, sheep, goats and swine of every</u>
9	age and sex.

11	"Nutrient." The term includes, but is not limited to:
12	(1) A substance or recognized plant nutrient, element or
13	compound that is used or sold for its plant nutritive content
14	<u>or its claimed nutritive value.</u>
15	(2) Livestock and poultry manures and their byproducts,
16	compost used as fertilizer, commercially manufactured
17	chemical fertilizers, biosolids or combinations of
18	commercially manufactured chemical biosolids.

20	Section 2. Section 4921(b) of Title 75 is amended to read:

25	(b) Special vehicles
26	(1) Any implement of husbandry or vehicle loaded with
27	[vegetable produce or forage] crops] <u>an agricultural</u>
28	commodity OR NUTRIENTS and not exceeding [11] 12 feet in
29	width may be driven, hauled or towed between sunrise and
30	sunset on highways other than freeways.

1 Any implement of husbandry not exceeding 14 feet 6 (2)2 inches in width may be driven, hauled or towed between 3 sunrise and sunset on highways other than freeways: Between parts of one farm owned or operated by 4 (i) 5 the owner of the implement of husbandry. Between farms owned or operated by the owner of 6 (ii) 7 the implement of husbandry located not more than 50 miles 8 apart. 9 (iii) Between: 10 farms; or (A) 11 a farm owned or operated by a farmer and a (B) 12 place of business of a mechanic or dealer in 13 implements of husbandry; 14 located not more than 150 miles away for the purpose of 15 buying, selling, trading, loaning and leasing, 16 demonstrating, repairing or servicing the implement of 17 husbandry. 18 (3) Special mobile equipment not exceeding nine feet two 19 inches in width may be driven, hauled or towed between 20 sunrise and sunset on highways other than freeways. {The} Except for an implement of husbandry, the 21 (4) 22 department may regulate the operation of special vehicles 23 subject to this subsection which regulations may prohibit the 24 operation of special vehicles on certain days or during 25 certain hours. 26 An implement of husbandry or vehicle used (5) 27 [exclusively for highly perishable crops for processing] to transport or harvest an agricultural commodity FOR CROPS OR 28 29 NUTRIENTS and not exceeding 14 feet 6 inches in width may be operated <u>at any time</u> on highways other than freeways {between 30

1 sunset and sunrise [only during the period of May 20 to 2 October 15]. The implement or vehicle, when used fat this 3 time - between sunset and sunrise, shall have two rotating yellow beacons and vehicular hazard signal lamps operating. 4 5 Commercial implements of husbandry not exceeding 12 (6) 6 feet in width, including wheels and tires, may be driven, 7 hauled or towed between sunrise and sunset on highways other 8 than freeways. (7) AS USED IN THIS SECTION, THE FOLLOWING WORDS AND 9 10 PHRASES SHALL HAVE THE MEANINGS GIVEN TO THEM IN THIS 11 SUBSECTION: 12 "CROP." THE TERM INCLUDES, BUT IS NOT LIMITED TO: 20 (I) A SUBSTANCE OR RECOGNIZED PLANT NUTRIENT, ELEMENT OR COMPOUND THAT IS USED OR SOLD FOR ITS PLANT 21 22 NUTRITIVE CONTENT OR ITS CLAIMED NUTRITIVE VALUE. 23 (II) LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY MANURES AND THEIR 24 BYPRODUCTS, COMPOST USED AS FERTILIZER, COMMERCIALLY 25 MANUFACTURED CHEMICAL FERTILIZERS, BIOSOLIDS OR 26 COMBINATIONS OF COMMERCIALLY MANUFACTURED CHEMICAL 27 BIOSOLIDS. 28 * * * 29 Section 3 2.
