1 2 3	Designating the week of May 15 through 21, 2011, as "Emergency Medical Services Week" and May 18, 2011, as "Emergency Medical Services for Children (EMSC) Day" in Pennsylvania.
4	WHEREAS, Emergency medical services are a vital public
5	service; and
6	WHEREAS, The members of emergency medical services teams are
7	ready to provide lifesaving care 24 hours a day, seven days a
8	week, to those in need; and
9	WHEREAS, Access to quality emergency care dramatically
10	improves the survival and recovery rate of those who experience
11	sudden illness or injury; and
12	WHEREAS, The emergency medical services system consists of
13	emergency physicians, emergency nurses, rescue personnel,
14	emergency medical technicians (EMTs), paramedics, prehospital
15	nurses, air medical personnel, emergency responders, first
16	responders, ambulance attendants, emergency vehicle operators,

1 firefighters, police officers, educators, dispatchers,

2 administrators and others; and

3 WHEREAS, The members of emergency medical services teams, 4 whether career or volunteer, engage in thousands of hours of 5 specialized training and continuing education to enhance their 6 lifesaving skills; and

7 WHEREAS, It is appropriate to recognize the value and the 8 accomplishments of emergency medical services providers who, by 9 their service, are everyday heroes; therefore be it 10 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the 11 week of May 15 through 21, 2011, as "Emergency Medical Services 12 Week" and May 18, 2011, as "Emergency Medical Services for 13 Children (EMSC) Day" in Pennsylvania.
