A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing some of the most significant military events in the
2 history of our nation.

3 WHEREAS, On April 11, 1783, the colonial Continental Congress
4 declared an end to the Revolutionary War; and

5 WHEREAS, On September 17, 1862, during the Battle of
6 Antietam, more Americans died than on any other day in the
7 nation's military history; and

8 WHEREAS, The treaty ending World War I was signed on November
9 11, 1918, a date which has been observed thereafter as Armistice
10 Day, Remembrance Day and Veterans' Day; and

11 WHEREAS, December 7, 1941, Pearl Harbor Day, was the day that
12 marked the United States' entry into World War II; and

13 WHEREAS, June 6, 1944, D-Day, marked the allied invasion of
14 Europe; and

15 WHEREAS, On July 27, 1953, the Armistice Agreement ending the

1 Korean Conflict was signed; and

2 WHEREAS, On August 15, 1973, the Case/Church Amendment passed
3 the United States Congress, concluding the United States'
4 involvement in the Vietnam War; and

5 WHEREAS, May 10, 1995, marked the official end to Desert
6 Storm; therefore be it

7 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize all of
8 the aforesaid events as significant events in our nation's
9 military history.
