- 1 Designating the week of October 16 through 22, 2011, as
- 2 "Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) Awareness
- 3 Week" in Pennsylvania.
- 4 WHEREAS, At least four million children, or 5% of the
- 5 pediatric population, and at least nine million adults, or 4% of
- 6 the adult population, in the United States have Attention
- 7 Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD); and
- 8 WHEREAS, Research shows that ADHD is the result of an
- 9 imbalance of neurotransmitters in the brain, and the primary
- 10 symptoms of ADHD are inattention, impulsiveness and
- 11 hyperactivity; and
- 12 WHEREAS, ADHD has been recognized as a legitimate diagnosis
- 13 of neurological disorder by the American Medical Association,
- 14 American Academy of Pediatrics, the United States Department of
- 15 Education, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the
- 16 National Institute of Mental Health, the American Psychiatric

- 1 Association and the American Academy of Child & Adolescent
- 2 Psychiatry; therefore be it
- 3 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 4 week of October 16 through 22, 2011, as "Attention Deficit
- 5 Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania.
