A RESOLUTION

- 1 Congratulating the Tobyhanna Army Depot on the occasion of the 100th anniversary of its arrival.
- 3 WHEREAS, Tobyhanna Army Depot is celebrating the 100th
- 4 anniversary of the Army's arrival at Tobyhanna in 1912; and
- 5 WHEREAS, That year, the Army's 3rd Field Artillery trained on
- 6 property leased in the Tobyhanna area; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Because of the success of that training, the Army
- 8 began the purchase of land, eventually acquiring more than
- 9 20,000 acres, for a permanent camp of instruction of field
- 10 artillery units; and
- 11 WHEREAS, During World War I, some of the Army's first tanks
- 12 were tested there, and the site continued as an artillery
- 13 training camp in the 1920s; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The site served several purposes during World War

- 1 II: as a storage point for gliders used in airborne operations
- 2 such as the D-Day Invasion; as a prisoner of war camp housing
- 3 200 German POWs and as a site for an Army hospital; and
- WHEREAS, The Army reacquired about 1,400 acres in 1951 to
- 5 build Tobyhanna Signal Depot, which officially opened on
- 6 February 1, 1953; and
- WHEREAS, Since then, Tobyhanna has grown into a worldwide
- 8 enterprise and is the Defense Department's largest and most
- 9 comprehensive center for the sustainment of command, control,
- 10 communications, computers, intelligence, surveillance and
- 11 reconnaissance systems; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Tobyhanna is northeastern Pennsylvania's largest
- 13 employer with about 5,500 personnel and has an annual economic
- 14 impact of \$4.4 billion in the region; therefore be it
- 15 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives congratulate all
- 16 of the personnel serving at the Tobyhanna Army Depot on the
- 17 occasion of its 100th anniversary of the Army's arrival at
- 18 Tobyhanna.
