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## A RESOLUTION

1 Directing the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to  
2 conduct a study to evaluate the delivery of services for  
3 Intellectual Disability Consolidated Waiver services, Child  
4 Welfare, Community-Based Mental Health, Intellectual  
5 Disability Community-Based Program and Drug and Alcohol  
6 services.

7 WHEREAS, The fiscal year 2012-2013 State budget appropriates  
8 more than \$2,600,000,000 for Intellectual Disability Community  
9 Waiver and Base Program services, Community-Based Mental Health  
10 services, Child Welfare services and Drug and Alcohol services;  
11 and

12 WHEREAS, A substantial portion of these services is delivered  
13 by nonprofit service providers; therefore be it

14 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the  
15 Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to conduct a study to  
16 evaluate the delivery of services for Intellectual Disability  
17 Consolidated Waiver services, Child Welfare, Community-Based  
18 Mental Health, Intellectual Disability Community-Based Program  
19 and Drug and Alcohol services; and be it further

1 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee,  
2 in consultation and cooperation with the Department of Public  
3 Welfare, collect and compile the expenditures for each nonprofit  
4 service provider, including the compensation of executives and  
5 the 20 highest paid employees, association dues, debts, assets,  
6 lobbying expenses, administrative expenses, operating costs and  
7 the indirect and direct costs of delivering care or services;  
8 and be it further

9 RESOLVED, THAT THE STUDY BE CONDUCTED USING EXISTING  
10 RESOURCES, SUCH AS THE NONPROFITS' 990 REPORTS AND THE LOBBY  
11 REPORTING MECHANISM IN THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE, WHENEVER  
12 POSSIBLE; AND BE IT FURTHER

13 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee  
14 provide a report regarding the expenditures of each nonprofit  
15 service provider and any other information the committee deems  
16 necessary; and be it further

17 RESOLVED, That the report shall include recommendations to  
18 address the unmet service needs of individuals and increase the  
19 efficiency and quality of the direct delivery system; and be it  
20 further

21 RESOLVED, That the report shall be submitted to the chairman  
22 and minority chairman of the Health Committee of the House of  
23 Representatives, the Human Services Committee of the House of  
24 Representatives and the Appropriations Committee of the House of  
25 Representatives by April 1, 2013.
