## A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing the week of September 23 through 29, 2012, as 2
  - "Historically Black Colleges and Universities Week" in
- 3 Pennsylvania.
- 4 WHEREAS, The Higher Education Act of 1965 defines a
- Historically Black College or University as, "any Historically 5
- Black College or University that was established prior to 1964, 6
- whose principal mission was, and is, the education of African
- 8 Americans, and that is accredited by a nationally recognized
- accrediting agency or association"; and
- WHEREAS, There are 105 Historically Black Colleges and 10
- 11 Universities (HBCUs) comprised of public, private, two-year and
- 12 four-year institutions, medical schools and community colleges
- 13 mainly located in the southeastern United States, the District
- 14 of Columbia and the Virgin Islands and 52 provide graduate
- 15 degree programs, while 27 offer doctoral programs; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Between 1976 and 2001, total HBCU enrollment grew

- 1 from approximately 180,000 students to 214,000 students in 2011;
- 2 and
- 3 WHEREAS, HBCUs are responsible for 16% of all African-
- 4 American higher education students in the nation; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Among African Americans, 40% of all congressmen,
- 6 12.5% of CEOs, 40% of engineers, 50% of professors at non-HBCUs,
- 7 50% of lawyers and 80% of judges are HBCU graduates; and
- 8 WHEREAS, This Commonwealth is home to 2 of the 105 HBCUs,
- 9 Lincoln and Cheyney Universities; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Lincoln University was chartered in April 1954 as
- 11 Ashmun Institute; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The institute was renamed in 1866 after President
- 13 Abraham Lincoln; and
- 14 WHEREAS, In 1972, the university formally associated with the
- 15 Commonwealth as a State-related coeducational university; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Lincoln University currently enrolls approximately
- 17 2,000 students and is located in southern Chester County
- 18 offering undergraduate programs and graduate programs in human
- 19 services, reading, education, mathematics and administration;
- 20 and
- 21 WHEREAS, Cheyney University was founded in 1837 by Richard
- 22 Humphrey; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Originally known as the "Institute for Colored
- 24 Youth," Cheyney University joined the State System of Higher
- 25 Education in 1983 and offers bachelor's degrees in more than 30
- 26 disciplines and a master's degree in education; and
- 27 WHEREAS, Notable alumni of HBCUs include Dr. Martin Luther
- 28 King, Jr., Langston Hughes, Thurgood Marshall, Ed Bradley, Oprah
- 29 Winfrey, Marion Wright Edelman, James Clyburn, Susan Taylor and
- 30 Booker T. Washington; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Students attending HBCUs are actively involved in
- 2 their surrounding communities and they learn the value of
- 3 community service, as it is often a graduation requirement to
- 4 complete a specified number of community-service hours prior to
- 5 graduation; and
- 6 WHEREAS, As a result of their desire to serve their
- 7 communities in a greater capacity, students often join
- 8 sororities and fraternities, some of which were founded on the
- 9 campuses of HBCUs, such as Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc.,
- 10 founded in 1908; Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc., founded in
- 11 1911; Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., founded in 1913; Phi
- 12 Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc., founded in 1914; Zeta Phi Beta
- 13 Sorority, Inc., founded in 1920; and Iota Phi Theta Fraternity,
- 14 Inc., established in 1963; and
- 15 WHEREAS, HBCUs create a solid educational foundation for
- 16 their students by preparing them to excel academically and
- 17 thrive socially and allowing students to create a strong network
- 18 of our nation's future leaders; and
- 19 WHEREAS, "Historically Black Colleges and Universities Week"
- 20 is being celebrated from September 23 through 29, 2012;
- 21 therefore be it
- 22 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 23 week of September 23 through 29, 2012, as "Historically Black
- 24 Colleges and Universities Week" in Pennsylvania.
