A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the important working relationship between the
- National Black Caucus of State Legislators (NBCSL) and the
- National Black Police Association (NBPA).
- 4 WHEREAS, The National Black Caucus of State Legislators
- 5 (NBCSL) is comprised of more than 600 African-American state
- 6 legislators and representatives from more than 120 corporations
- 7 and labor unions across the country; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The NBCSL serves as a national network and
- 9 clearinghouse for the discussion, dissemination and exchange of
- 10 ideas and information among African-American state legislators
- 11 and their staffs; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The NBCSL provides research, training and
- 13 educational services that help to improve the effectiveness and
- 14 quality of African-American state legislators and their staffs;
- 15 and
- 16 WHEREAS, The NBCSL is a strong, united and effective advocate

- 1 for African-American state legislators and their constituencies
- 2 at the Federal level; and
- 3 WHEREAS, In November 1972, the National Black Police
- 4 Association (NBPA) was chartered as a not-for-profit corporation
- 5 in the state of Illinois following a historic meeting in St.
- 6 Louis, Missouri, where 13 African American Peace Associations
- 7 were present at the meeting with representatives from over 20
- 8 cities across the country, including Philadelphia and
- 9 Pittsburgh; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The NBPA is a nationwide organization of African
- 11 American Police Associations dedicated to the promotion of
- 12 justice, fairness and effectiveness in law enforcement; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The NBPA serves as an advocate for minority police
- 14 officers and establishes a national network for the training and
- 15 education of all police officers and others interested in law
- 16 enforcement; and
- 17 WHEREAS, The NBPA was established to improve the relationship
- 18 between police departments and the minority communities and to
- 19 evaluate the effect of the policies and programs within the
- 20 criminal justice system upon the minority community; and
- 21 WHEREAS, The NBPA serves as a mechanism to recruit minority
- 22 police officers on a national scale and works toward police
- 23 reform in order to eliminate police corruption, police brutality
- 24 and racial discrimination; and
- 25 WHEREAS, Past and present members of the Pennsylvania General
- 26 Assembly and representatives from the Philadelphia Sheriff's
- 27 Office conducted a seminar at the Annual National Black Police
- 28 Association Conference discussing the necessity for the two
- 29 organizations of police officers and legislators to continue
- 30 working together for the sake of their communities; therefore be

- 5 Association (NBPA); and be it further
- 6 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge the National
- 7 Black Police Association and the National Black Caucus of State
- 8 Legislators to propose resolutions at their annual conferences
- 9 that state their ongoing commitment to a strong, dedicated,
- 10 working relationship; and be it further
- 11 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge the two
- 12 organizations' executive officers to continue to share and
- 13 exchange contact information and communicate with their
- 14 respective organization's membership and constituencies on a
- 15 regular basis; and be it further
- 16 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize and
- 17 honor the vital relationship between these two important
- 18 organizations.
