AN ACT

1 Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), entitled,
2 as amended, "An act relating to the finances of the State
3 government; providing for the settlement, assessment,
4 collection, and lien of taxes, bonus, and all other accounts
5 due the Commonwealth, the collection and recovery of fees and
6 other money or property due or belonging to the Commonwealth,
7 or any agency thereof, including escheated property and the
8 proceeds of its sale, the custody and disbursement or other
9 disposition of funds and securities belonging to or in the
10 possession of the Commonwealth, and the settlement of claims
11 against the Commonwealth, the resettlement of accounts and
12 appeals to the courts, refunds of moneys erroneously paid to
13 the Commonwealth, auditing the accounts of the Commonwealth
14 and all agencies thereof, of all public officers collecting
15 moneys payable to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof,
16 and all receipts of appropriations from the Commonwealth,
17 authorizing the Commonwealth to issue tax anticipation notes
18 to defray current expenses, implementing the provisions of
19 section 7(a) of Article VIII of the Constitution of
20 Pennsylvania authorizing and restricting the incurring of
21 certain debt and imposing penalties; affecting every
22 department, board, commission, and officer of the State
23 government, every political subdivision of the State, and
24 certain officers of such subdivisions, every person,
25 association, and corporation required to pay, assess, or
26 collect taxes, or to make returns or reports under the laws
27 imposing taxes for State purposes, or to pay license fees or
28 other moneys to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof,
29 every State depository and every debtor or creditor of the
30 Commonwealth," providing for State-owned vehicle use.

31 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

1 hereby enacts as follows:

2 Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known
3 as The Fiscal Code, is amended by adding an article to read:

4 ARTICLE XV-B

5 STATE-OWNED VEHICLE USE

6 Section 1501-B. Definitions.

7 The following words and phrases when used in this article
8 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
9 context clearly indicates otherwise:

10 "Department." The Department of General Services of the
11 Commonwealth.

12 "State employee." The term does not include an elected
13 public official of the State government.

14 "State entity." A Commonwealth or judicial agency.

15 "State-owned vehicle." A vehicle that is owned by the
16 Commonwealth. The term shall not include vehicles used for law
17 enforcement purposes by persons that have arrest powers.

18 Section 1502-B. Vehicle registry.

19 The department and each State entity shall post and maintain
20 a list of State employees, contract employees and independent
21 contractors under its jurisdiction who are assigned a State-
22 owned vehicle on its respective Internet website. The list shall
23 include the State employee's, contract employee's and
24 independent contractor's name, State entity, title and year and
25 make of the State-owned vehicle. The list shall be updated every
26 90 days, except that previous years' lists shall remain posted
27 and available.

28 Section 1503-B. Official use license plate.

29 Any State-owned vehicle assigned to a State employee,
30 contract employee or independent contractor shall have an

1 official use license plate unless the State employee, contract
2 employee or independent contractor to whom that State-owned
3 vehicle is assigned performs undercover law enforcement duties.

4 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
