## AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of December 4, 1996 (P.L.911, No.147), entitled
- 2 "An act providing for registration requirements for
- telemarketers and for powers and duties of the Office of
- Attorney General," further providing for definitions and for
- 5 registration requirement; and providing for unwanted
- 6 automatic political calls.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. The definition of "list administrator" in section
- 10 2 of the act of December 4, 1996 (P.L.911, No.147), known as the
- 11 Telemarketer Registration Act, amended September 12, 2003
- 12 (P.L.105, No.22), is amended and the section is amended by
- 13 adding definitions to read:
- 14 Section 2. Definitions.
- 15 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 16 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 17 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 18 "Automatic dialing-announcing device." A device that selects

- 1 and dials telephone numbers and that, working alone or in
- 2 conjunction with other equipment, disseminates a prerecorded or
- 3 <u>synthesized voice message to the telephone number called.</u>
- 4 <u>"Automatic political call." The use of an automatic dialing-</u>
- 5 <u>announcing device on behalf of any of the following:</u>
- 6 (1) A candidate as defined in section 102(a) of the act
- of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), known as the Pennsylvania
- 8 <u>Election Code; a party as defined in section 102(n) of the</u>
- 9 <u>Pennsylvania Election Code; or a political body as defined in</u>
- section 102(p) of the Pennsylvania Election Code.
- 11 (2) A political committee as defined in section 1621(h)
- of the Pennsylvania Election Code.
- 13 (3) A political organization as defined in section
- 14 527(e) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (Public Law
- 15 99-514, 26 U.S.C. § 1 et seq.).
- 16 \* \* \*
- "List administrator." [A nonprofit] An organization, as
- 18 designated by contract entered into by the Director of the
- 19 Bureau of Consumer Protection in the Office of Attorney General,
- 20 that accepts individual names, addresses and telephone numbers
- 21 of persons who do not wish to receive telephone solicitation
- 22 calls and that has been in existence for ten or more years. In
- 23 the event that the Federal Trade Commission and/or Federal
- 24 Communications Commission establish a unified national No Call
- 25 Registry for the purpose of providing consumers with protection
- 26 from receiving unwanted telephone solicitation calls similar to
- 27 the protection provided in this act, then the Director of the
- 28 Bureau of Consumer Protection in the Office of Attorney General
- 29 may enter into an agreement to utilize the services of the
- 30 administrator of any such national No Call Registry in lieu of

- 1 using [any nonprofit] an organization.
- 2 \* \* \*
- 3 Section 2. Section 3 of the act is amended to read:
- 4 Section 3. Registration requirement.
- 5 (a) General rule. -- In addition to any other requirements
- 6 imposed by law, a telemarketer or the telemarketing business
- 7 which employs the telemarketer is required to register with the
- 8 Office of Attorney General at least 30 days prior to offering
- 9 for sale consumer goods or services through any medium. This
- 10 section will not apply, however, to persons or businesses
- 11 licensed by or registered with a Federal or Commonwealth agency
- 12 <u>or to a person or business conducting telemarketing exclusively</u>
- 13 through the use of automatic political calls. Notwithstanding
- 14 any other provision of this act, any business which provides
- 15 telemarketing services to other entities and has been under the
- 16 same ownership and control for less than five years shall
- 17 register under this section.
- 18 (b) Unlawful conduct. -- It shall be unlawful for any
- 19 telemarketer to initiate a telephone call to or receive a
- 20 telephone call from a consumer in connection with the purchase
- 21 of consumer goods or services unless the telemarketer or the
- 22 telemarketing business which employs the telemarketer is
- 23 registered with the Office of Attorney General.
- 24 (c) Penalty. -- Failure to register as required by this act
- 25 constitutes a misdemeanor of the second degree.
- Section 3. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 27 <u>Section 5.3. Unwanted automatic political calls.</u>
- 28 (a) General rule.--
- 29 <u>(1) Except as set forth in subsection (b), beginning 30</u>
- days after publication of the notice under paragraph (3), a

- 1 person may not initiate or cause to be initiated an automatic
- 2 political call to a residential or wireless telephone number
- of a telephone subscriber who does not wish to receive
- 4 <u>automatic political calls and has caused the subscriber's</u>
- 5 <u>name</u>, address and telephone number to be enrolled on a do-
- 6 <u>not-call list for automatic political calls maintained by a</u>
- 7 <u>list administrator</u>.
- 8 (2) The list under paragraph (1) shall be developed and
- 9 <u>maintained separately from the list established under section</u>
- 10 5.2.
- 11 (3) The list under paragraph (1) shall be completed by
- 12 <u>September 15, 2012. The list administrator shall transmit a</u>
- 13 <u>notice of completion to the Legislative Reference Bureau for</u>
- 14 <u>publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.</u>
- 15 <u>(4) A residential telephone subscriber's name shall be</u>
- 16 <u>maintained on the list under paragraph (1) as long as the</u>
- 17 telephone number is valid for the subscriber.
- 18 <u>(5) The Office of Attorney General may serve as the list</u>
- 19 administrator for purposes of this subsection.
- 20 (6) If the Office of Attorney General does not serve as
- 21 the list administrator for purposes of this subsection, the
- 22 list administrator shall provide the list under paragraph (1)
- 23 to the Office of Attorney General on a biannual basis.
- (b) Exceptions. -- Subsection (a) (1) shall not apply to a call
- 25 on behalf of a political candidate, political party or political
- 26 body made by an individual and not by an automatic dialing-
- 27 <u>announcing device.</u>
- 28 (c) Listings.--A person that makes automatic political calls
- 29 shall:
- 30 (1) obtain on a biannual basis a listing of residential

- or wireless telephone subscribers in this Commonwealth who
- 2 have arranged to have their names, addresses and telephone
- 3 numbers enrolled on the list under subsection (a)(1); or
- 4 (2) use a service provider who has obtained the list
- 5 <u>under subsection (a)(1) in order to restrict the use of</u>
- 6 <u>automatic political calls.</u>
- 7 (d) Fee limitation. -- A list administrator may not impose a
- 8 fee for a copy of the list under subsection (a) (1) which
- 9 <u>exceeds:</u>
- 10 (1) the cost incurred by the list administrator in the
- 11 production, preparation and distribution of the list; or
- 12 (2) the fee authorized by 16 CFR § 310.8(c) (relating to
- fee for access to the National Do Not Call Registry).
- 14 (e) Restriction. -- A person may not use the list under
- 15 <u>subsection (a)(1) for any purpose other than to remove a</u>
- 16 <u>residential or wireless telephone subscriber from a call list.</u>
- 17 (f) Investigation, enforcement and reporting. --
- 18 Investigation, enforcement and reporting shall be conducted in
- 19 <u>accordance with section 5.2(k).</u>
- 20 (g) Violation. -- A violation of this section shall constitute
- 21 an unlawful act under section 3 of the act of December 17, 1968
- 22 (P.L.1224, No.387), known as the Unfair Trade Practices and
- 23 Consumer Protection Law.
- 24 Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
