## AN ACT

- Amending the act of August 9, 1955 (P.L.323, No.130), entitled, as amended, "An act relating to counties of the first, third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth classes; amending, 3 revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto; relating to imposition of excise taxes by counties, including authorizing imposition of an excise tax on the rental of motor vehicles by counties of the first class; and providing for regional renaissance initiatives," authorizing 8 the abolition of jury commissioners in certain counties of 9 the second class A. 10 11 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 12 hereby enacts as follows: 13 Section 1. Section 401 of the act of August 9, 1955 (P.L. 14 323, No.130), known as The County Code, is amended by adding a 15 subsection to read: Section 401. Enumeration of Elected Officers. -- \* \* \* 16 17 (f) After review of the procedures in effect within the 18 county to ensure that lists of potential jurors are a 19 representative cross section of the community, the governing 20 body of a county of the second class A having a population under
- 21 the 2010 Federal decennial census in excess of 600,000

- 1 <u>residents</u>, but less than 630,000 residents, may adopt, by a
- 2 <u>majority vote</u>, a resolution abolishing the office of jury
- 3 commissioner. Upon approval of the resolution, the office of
- 4 jury commissioner shall expire at the completion of the current
- 5 jury commissioners' terms of office. The resolution shall not be
- 6 passed in any year in which the office of jury commissioner is
- 7 on the ballot.
- 8 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 30 days.
