AN ACT

Amending the act of April 14, 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), entitled "An act relating to the manufacture, sale and possession of 2 controlled substances, other drugs, devices and cosmetics; 3 conferring powers on the courts and the secretary and 4 Department of Health, and a newly created Pennsylvania Drug, 5 Device and Cosmetic Board; establishing schedules of controlled substances; providing penalties; requiring 7 registration of persons engaged in the drug trade and for the 8 revocation or suspension of certain licenses and 9 registrations; and repealing an act," providing for automatic 10 changes to schedules of controlled substances. 11 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 13 hereby enacts as follows: 14 Section 1. The act of April 14, 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), known 15 as The Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act, is 16 amended by adding a section to read: 17 Section 4.1. Automatic Changes to Schedules of Controlled 18 Substances. -- (a) When, pursuant to the Federal drug abuse 19 control laws, the Federal Government adds a compound mixture, 20 preparation or substance to the schedules of controlled 21 substances or transfers any of the same between one schedule to

another or removes a compound mixture preparation or substance

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- 1 from the schedules of controlled substances, then such addition,
- 2 transfer or removal shall occur to the corresponding schedule or
- 3 schedules of controlled substances contained in this act. The
- 4 change in schedule shall be effective within sixty days from the
- 5 date of the Federal scheduling change and the secretary shall
- 6 <u>publish notice of the change as a notice in the Pennsylvania</u>
- 7 Bulletin.
- 8 (b) If any person objects to the change in schedule during
- 9 the sixty-day period the objection may be submitted to the
- 10 secretary and the secretary shall proceed according to the
- 11 provisions of section 3 by requesting advice in writing from the
- 12 board.
- 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
