## AN ACT

- Amending the act of July 8, 1978 (P.L.752, No.140), entitled "An act providing for the forfeiture of the pensions of certain 2 public employees and authorizing the State or political 3 subdivision to garnish the pension benefits of certain public officers and employees upon conviction of certain criminal activity related to their office or position of employment," 6 further providing for definitions, for disqualification and forfeiture of benefits and for restitution for monetary loss. 8 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 10 hereby enacts as follows: 11 Section 1. Section 2 of the act of July 8, 1978 (P.L.752, 12 No.140), known as the Public Employee Pension Forfeiture Act, is 13 amended by adding a definition to read: 14 Section 2. Definitions. 15 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall have, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, the 16 17 meanings given to them in this section: 18 "Infamous crime." As determined under section 7 of Article 19

- 2 Section 2. Sections 3(a) and 4(a) of the act are amended to

- 4 Section 3. Disqualification and forfeiture of benefits.
- 5 (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, no public
- 6 official or public employee nor any beneficiary designated by
- 7 such public official or public employee shall be entitled to
- 8 receive any retirement or other benefit or payment of any kind
- 9 except a return of the contribution paid into any pension fund
- 10 without interest, if such public official or public employee is
- 11 convicted or pleads guilty or no defense to any infamous crime
- 12 or crime related to public office or public employment.

- 14 Section 4. Restitution for monetary loss.
- 15 (a) Whenever any public official or employee who is a member
- 16 of any pension system funded by public moneys is convicted or
- 17 pleads guilty or pleads no defense in any court of record to any
- 18 <u>infamous crime or</u> crime related to a public office or public
- 19 employment, the court shall order the defendant to make complete
- 20 and full restitution to the Commonwealth or political
- 21 subdivision of any monetary loss incurred as a result of the
- 22 criminal offense.
