## AN ACT

7	<u>§ 7901. Short title of chapter.</u>
8	This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the
9	<u>Pennsylvania Disaster Emergency Assistance Act.</u>
10	§ 7902. Legislative findings and purpose of chapter.
11	(a) FindingsThe General Assembly finds as follows:
12	(1) Communities in this Commonwealth are frequently
13	subject to natural and man-made disasters which cause
14	significant damage and disruption in the life of the
15	community but which are not of sufficient magnitude to
16	<u>qualify for Federal disaster assistance programs.</u>
17	(2) These losses have a significant impact on those
18	directly affected and their communities and on the health and
19	welfare of the citizens of this Commonwealth's many small
20	communities.
21	(b) PurposeIt is the purpose of this chapter to create a
22	State program to provide assistance to individuals and political
23	subdivisions directly affected by natural and man-made
24	disasters. State assistance will be limited to grants to help
25	repair damages to primary residences, personal property and
26	public facilities. Grants will be made available by the State in
27	a disaster emergency area only when a Presidential disaster
28	declaration is not covering the area.
29	<u>§ 7903. Definitions.</u>
30	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter

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1	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
2	context clearly indicates otherwise:
3	"Account." The Disaster Emergency Assistance Account
4	established under this chapter.
5	"Adjusted loss." The difference between:
6	(1) eligible loss; and
7	(2) covered loss.
8	"Agency." The Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency.
9	"Covered loss." Any amount received by or due the recipient
10	from private insurance and Federal grants and loans, including
11	applicable State matching funds, on account of an eligible loss.
12	The term does not include an insurance deductible paid by the
13	recipient.
14	"Disaster emergency area." An area included under a
15	declaration of disaster emergency issued by the Governor under
16	section 7301 (relating to general authority of Governor).
17	"Eligible loss." Damage, caused by a natural or man-made
18	disaster in a disaster emergency area, to real property utilized
19	as a primary residence of the owner, personal property or a
20	public facility.
21	"Household." A social unit living together and comprised of
22	any of the following:
23	(1) Couples or legally married individuals and their
24	<u>dependents.</u>
25	(2) An individual and his dependents.
26	(3) Individuals who jointly own a residence and their
27	<u>dependents.</u>
28	(4) Two or more individuals living at the same address,
29	whether related or not.
30	"Liquor tax." The tax imposed under the act of June 9, 1936
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1	(1st Sp.Sess., P.L.13, No.4), entitled as "An act imposing an
2	emergency State tax on liquor, as herein defined, sold by the
3	Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing for the collection
4	and payment of such tax; and imposing duties upon the Department
5	of Revenue and the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board."
6	"Man-made disaster." Any industrial, nuclear or
7	transportation accident, explosion, conflagration, power
8	failure, natural resource shortage or other condition, except
9	enemy action, resulting from man-made causes, such as oil spills
10	and other injurious environmental contamination, which threatens
11	or causes substantial damage to property, human suffering,
12	<u>hardship or loss of life.</u>
13	"Natural disaster." Any hurricane, tornado, storm, flood,
14	<u>high water, wind-driven water, tidal wave, earthquake,</u>
15	<u>landslide, mudslide, snowstorm, drought, fire, explosion or</u>
16	other catastrophe not resulting from a man-made cause which
17	results in substantial damage to property, hardship, suffering
18	or possible loss of life.
19	"Personal property." Clothing, furniture, necessary
20	household items and appliances and essential tools for
21	employment or education.
22	"Public facility." Any facility which is owned, operated or
23	maintained by a political subdivision of this Commonwealth. The
24	term shall include:
25	(1) buildings and equipment;
26	(2) bridges, roads, highways and public ways;
27	(3) parks and recreational facilities;
28	(4) power generation and distribution facilities,
29	including natural gas systems, wind turbines, generators,
30	substations and power lines;

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1	(5) sanitary sewer systems and wastewater treatment
2	<u>facilities;</u>
3	(6) drainage and flood control facilities;
4	(7) water treatment, water storage and water
5	distribution facilities; and
6	(8) any other improvement or infrastructure.
7	<u>§ 7904. Construction.</u>
8	Grants under this chapter shall be made to individuals and
9	political subdivisions in a disaster emergency area for which no
10	Presidential disaster declaration has been issued. There shall
11	be a grant program under this chapter for individuals known as
12	the Individual Disaster Assistance Grant Program. There shall be
13	a grant program under this chapter for political subdivisions
14	known as the Public Disaster Assistance Grant Program.

5	§ 7913. Application for and issuance of grant.
6	(a) ApplicationThe procedure for applying for a grant
7	under this subchapter shall be as follows:
8	(1) An individual must apply for a grant on a form
9	furnished by the agency, setting forth the facts establishing
10	eligibility and certifying that if approved all funds
11	received will be used for purposes approved by the agency. An
12	application under this paragraph is subject to 18 Pa.C.S. §
13	4904 (relating to unsworn falsification to authorities). The
14	application must be submitted within 60 days following the
15	declaration of a disaster emergency. Only one individual may
16	apply per household.
17	(2) The agency shall investigate the application to
18	determine eligibility.
19	(3) Within 30 days of receipt of the application, the
20	agency shall make an eligibility determination. An
21	eligibility determination under this paragraph is a final
22	order of the agency subject to review under 2 Pa.C.S. Ch. 7
23	Subch. A (relating to judicial review of Commonwealth agency
24	action).
25	(b) IssuanceFor each individual determined to be eligible
26	under subsection (a)(3), the agency shall verify the adjusted
27	loss. The maximum grant allowed under the Individual Disaster
28	Assistance Grant Program is \$10,000 or the adjusted loss,
29	whichever is less.
30	<u>§ 7914. Use of grant funds.</u>

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1	Grant funds issued under the Individual Disaster Assistance
2	Grant Program may be used for the following disaster-related
3	expenses:
4	(1) Assisting in repair or replacement of the owner-
5	occupied primary residence, including mobile homes. Funds may
6	be used for removal of disaster-generated debris but may not
7	be used for landscaping.
8	(2) Repair, replacement or cleaning of personal
9	property.
10	(3) Repair or replacement of a motor vehicle which is
11	registered to the applicant and essential for transportation.
12	(4) Temporary housing.
13	(5) Funeral expenses.
14	(6) Medical or dental expenses.

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	<u>To be eligible for a grant under this subchapter, a political</u>

3	insurance.
4	§ 7923. Application for and issuance of grant.
5	(a) ApplicationThe procedure for applying for a grant
6	under this subchapter shall be as follows:
7	(1) A political subdivision must apply for a grant on a
8	form furnished by the agency, setting forth the facts
9	establishing eligibility and certifying that if approved all
10	funds received will be used for purposes approved by the
11	agency. An application under this paragraph is subject to 18
12	<u>Pa.C.S. § 4904 (relating to unsworn falsification to</u>
13	authorities). The application must be submitted within 60
14	days following the declaration of a disaster emergency.
15	(2) The agency shall investigate the application to
16	<u>determine eligibility.</u>
17	(3) Within 30 days of receipt of the application, the
18	agency shall make an eligibility determination. An
19	eligibility determination under this paragraph is a final
20	order of the agency subject to review under 2 Pa.C.S. Ch. 7
21	Subch. A (relating to judicial review of Commonwealth agency
22	action).
23	(b) IssuanceFor each political subdivision determined to
24	be eligible under subsection (a) (3), the agency shall verify the
25	adjusted loss. The maximum grant allowed under the Public
26	Disaster Assistance Grant Program is 50% of the eligible loss.
27	<u>§ 7924. Use of grant funds.</u>
28	Grant funds issued under the Public Disaster Assistance Grant
29	Program may be used to assist in the repair or replacement of
30	public facilities due to disaster-related damages. Funds may

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1	also be used for disaster-related debris removal or to demolish
2	a public facility if the facility was made unsafe by the
3	<u>disaster.</u>

10	<u>§ 7931. Disaster Emergency Assistance Account.</u>
11	(a) EstablishmentA restricted account is hereby
12	established in the State Treasury to be known as the Disaster
13	Emergency Assistance Account. The account shall be for the
14	purpose of making grants that shall be provided by the agency to
15	individuals and political subdivisions eligible for assistance
16	under the Individual Disaster Assistance Grant Program and the
17	<u>Public Disaster Assistance Grant Program.</u>
18	(b) TransferThe Department of Revenue shall annually
19	transfer \$16,000,000 of the revenue received by the Commonwealth
20	pursuant to the imposition of the liquor tax from the General
21	Fund to the account for the fiscal year July 1, 2012, through
22	June 30, 2013, and each fiscal year thereafter.
23	(c) AppropriationMoneys transferred to the account are
24	hereby appropriated from the account for the payment of grants
25	authorized under Subchapters B (relating to Individual Disaster
26	Assistance Grant Program) and C (relating to Public Disaster
27	<u>Assistance Grant Program).</u>
28	(d) LapseAt the end of each fiscal year, designated funds
29	which are not expended shall lapse to the General Fund.
30	<u>§ 7932. Powers and duties of agency.</u>

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1	The agency shall have the following duties and
2	responsibilities:
3	(1) Administer this chapter.
4	(2) Promulgate any regulations necessary to implement
5	and administer this chapter which include:
6	(i) Development of additional procedures or
7	requirements for the submission of grant applications.
8	(ii) Development of procedures to verify adjusted
9	loss.
10	(iii) Development of criteria for the determination
11	of the amount of assistance to be given to an individual
12	or political subdivision.
13	<u>§ 7933. Audit by Auditor General.</u>
14	The Auditor General shall conduct a performance audit
15	annually to determine the effectiveness of this chapter. The
16	Auditor General shall report the audit findings annually to the
17	<u>General Assembly.</u>
18	Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2012, or
19	immediately, whichever is later.
