- Recognizing the week of April 8 through 14, 2012, as "Library Week 2012" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, First sponsored in 1958, "National Library Week" is
- 4 a national observance sponsored by the American Library
- 5 Association and libraries across the country each April; and
- 6 WHEREAS, "National Library Week" celebrates the contributions
- 7 of libraries, librarians and library workers throughout the
- 8 United States; and
- 9 WHEREAS, All types of libraries across the country
- 10 participate, including school, public or academic and special
- 11 libraries; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Our libraries are bringing the Pennsylvania Forward
- 13 Program to the public by helping our citizens achieve 21st
- 14 century literacies, including basic literacy, information
- 15 literacy, civic and social literacy, health literacy and

- 1 financial literacy, which lead to greater self-sufficiency and a
- 2 stronger economic future; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The 2012 theme, "You Belong @ Your Library®,"
- 4 emphasizes that there is something for everyone at the library,
- 5 whether it be resources for job seekers, free activities for
- 6 children, access to computers or discovering a new favorite
- 7 book; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Libraries have historically served as our nation's
- 9 great equalizers of knowledge by providing free access to all
- 10 regardless of age, ethnicity or socioeconomic background; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Libraries work to meet the changing needs of their
- 12 users, including building collections, expanding outreach
- 13 services and increasing programming; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Our libraries have moved far beyond just being book
- 15 depositories; librarians design and offer programs to meet their
- 16 community's economic needs, providing residents with resume-
- 17 writing classes, interviewing workshops and job-seeking
- 18 resources; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Families can spend hours together exploring their
- 20 local library for free, finding a wide variety of reading
- 21 materials that will rekindle memories as well as spark new
- 22 interests; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Libraries offer a world of knowledge and opportunity
- 24 to residents in local communities throughout this Commonwealth;

- 26 WHEREAS, Librarians, who are valuable community resources,
- 27 help people of all ages and backgrounds find and interpret the
- 28 information they need to live, learn and work; and
- 29 WHEREAS, "National Library Week" encourages all residents to
- 30 visit their local library to take advantage of the wonderful
