A RESOLUTION

Designating May 5, 2012, as "Childhood Stroke Awareness Day" in 1 2 Pennsylvania. 3 WHEREAS, The incidence of stroke is not restricted to adults, but occurs in children before, during and after birth; and 4 5 WHEREAS, Pediatric strokes affect one in every 3,000 to 4,000 children, including children in utero up to 18 years of age; and 6 7 WHEREAS, At least one out of ten children with ischemic 8 stroke will have a recurrence within five years; and 9 WHEREAS, Acute ischemic stroke has been estimated to occur as much as three in ten thousand births in infants; and 10 11 WHEREAS, Up to a third of children who have had a stroke will 12 have a recurrent stroke; and 13 WHEREAS, Nine percent of children who suffer strokes will 14 die; and 15 WHEREAS, More than half of the children who suffer a stroke will develop lifelong cognitive or motor disability in addition 16 to, but not limited to, long-term neurological disabilities; and 17

1 WHEREAS, Children suffering a stroke may have paralysis of 2 one side of the body, seizures, speech and vision problems and 3 learning difficulties that may require ongoing physical, speech 4 and occupational therapy in addition to surgeries, including 5 orthopedic and brain surgery; and

6 WHEREAS, Very little is known about childhood stroke,
7 treatment and prevention, and only through medical research and
8 education may effective treatment and prevention techniques be
9 developed; and

10 WHEREAS, Early diagnosis of childhood stroke is essential for 11 implementing early intervention through services such as speech, 12 occupational and physical therapy, as well as assisting in the 13 prevention of recurrence; therefore be it

14 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate May 5, 2012, as
15 "Childhood Stroke Awareness Day" in Pennsylvania; and be it
16 further

17 RESOLVED, That the Senate urge all citizens to support the 18 efforts, programs, education, services and advocacy that the 19 Pediatric Stroke Network, Inc., provide as it strives to enhance 20 public awareness of childhood stroke.
