1 2 3	Amending Title 27 (Environmental Resources) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in conservation and natural resources, providing for water well construction standards.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Title 27 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
7	Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

1	S	3301.	Scope	of	chapter.

2	This chapter provides for water well construction standards.
3	<u>§ 3302. Definitions.</u>
4	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
5	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
6	context clearly indicates otherwise:
7	"Abandoned well." A water well that is no longer equipped in
8	such a manner as to be able to draw groundwater. This term
9	includes a water well where the pump, piping or electrical
10	components have been disconnected or removed or when its use on
11	a regular or prescribed basis has been discontinued. The term
12	does not include a water well that is not currently used, but is
13	equipped or otherwise properly maintained in such a manner as to
14	<u>be able to draw groundwater as an alternative, backup or</u>
15	supplemental water source.
16	"Casing." An impervious durable pipe placed in a water well
17	to prevent the walls from caving in and to seal off surface
18	drainage or undesirable water, gas or other fluids and to
19	prevent them from entering the water well.
20	"Decommissioning." The process of properly filling and
21	sealing an abandoned well.
22	"Department." The Department of Environmental Protection of
23	the Commonwealth.
24	"Drilling." An act necessary to the construction of a water
25	well, including, but not limited to, drilling, boring, coring,
26	washing, jetting and driving.
27	"Groundwater." Water beneath the surface of the ground
28	within a zone of saturation, whether or not flowing through
29	known and definite channels or percolating through underground
30	geologic formations and regardless of whether the result of
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1	natural or artificial recharge. The term includes water
2	contained in an aquifer, artesian and nonartesian basin,
3	underground watercourse and any other body of water below the
4	surface of the earth.
5	"Grout." A permanent water tight joint or connection made by
6	filling with concrete, neat cement, or other approved impervious
7	material between the casing and the undisturbed formation
8	surrounding a water well or between two strings of casing.
9	"Person." A natural person, association, partnership or
10	corporation. Whenever used in any provision of this chapter
11	prescribing and imposing a penalty or imposing a fine or
12	imprisonment, or both, the term, as applied to an association,
13	shall include the members thereof and, as applied to a
14	corporation, the officers thereof. The provisions of this
15	chapter restricting or regulating the actions of any person
16	shall be construed as regulating or restricting the actions of
17	the employees and agents of such person.
18	"Public water system." A system that provides water to the
19	public for human consumption and has at least 15 service
20	connections or regularly serves an average of at least 25
21	individuals daily at least 60 days per year. The term includes
22	collection, treatment, storage and distribution facilities
23	whether or not they are under the control of the operator of the
24	system and used in connection with the system.
25	"Test-well." A hole drilled for the sole purpose of
26	measuring groundwater quantity and availability.
27	"Water for human consumption." The term includes water that
28	is used for drinking, bathing and showering, cooking,
29	<u>dishwashing or maintaining oral hygiene.</u>
30	"Water well." An excavation that is drilled, bored, cored,

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1	washed, driven, jetted or otherwise constructed when the
2	intended use of the excavation is for the location, diversion or
3	acquisition of groundwater for purposes which may include, but
4	are not limited to, human consumption, irrigation, industrial
5	process, production or cooling purposes, groundwater dewatering,
6	investigation, monitoring, testing or remediation. The term does
7	not include an excavation for the purposes of:
8	(1) obtaining or prospecting for oil, natural gas,
9	minerals or products of mining or quarrying;
10	(2) inserting media to repressure oil-bearing or natural
11	gas-bearing formation, storing petroleum or other materials;
12	or
13	(3) a public water system regulated under the act of May
14	1, 1984 (P.L.206, No.43), known as the Pennsylvania Safe
15	Drinking Water Act.
16	"Water well completion report." A report that describes
17	where, when and how a well was constructed and includes a
18	section outlining the water well owner's responsibilities,
19	including the decommissioning of abandoned wells, under this
20	<u>act.</u>
21	"Water well decommissioning report." A report that describes
22	where, when and how a well was decommissioned.
23	"Water well driller." A water well contractor who is
24	licensed under the act of May 29, 1956 (1955 P.L.1840, No.610),
25	known as the Water Well Drillers License Act, and has contracted
26	for the drilling, digging, driving, boring, coring, washing,
27	jetting, constructing, altering, repairing or decommissioning of
28	<u>a water well.</u>
29	"Water well owner." A person who owns land that is used for
30	any purpose and on which a water well has been drilled.
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1	§ 3303. Water well construction standards and decommissioning
2	of abandoned wells.
3	(a) Water well construction standardsAll water wells in
4	this Commonwealth shall be constructed by a water well driller
5	in accordance with water well construction standards, as
6	<pre>promulgated ADOPTED under section 3304 (relating to powers and <</pre>
7	<u>duties).</u>
8	(b) Decommissioning of abandoned wells
9	(1) All water well owners shall be responsible for the
10	decommissioning of abandoned wells.
11	(2) All abandoned wells in this Commonwealth shall be
12	decommissioned by a water well driller in accordance with
13	decommissioning standards as promulgated ADOPTED under <
14	section 3304.
15	(3) Water wells abandoned after the adoption of
16	regulations promulgated under section 3304 shall be <
17	decommissioned within one year following abandonment. Water
18	wells abandoned prior to the effective date of this section
19	shall be decommissioned within two years of the adoption of
20	regulations promulgated under section 3304. <
21	(c) Water well completion or decommissioning reportsA
22	water well driller shall provide the Department of Conservation
23	and Natural Resources, as required under the act of May 29, 1956
24	(1955 P.L.1840, No.610), known as the Water Well Drillers
25	License Act, the department and water well owner, upon forms to
26	be prescribed by the department, a copy of a water well
27	completion or decommissioning report.
28	(d) ExemptionCounties or municipalities with existing
29	ordinances, upon the effective date of this section, relating to
30	water well construction or decommissioning standards, to the

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1	extent that such ordinances are consistent with the regulations
2	promulgated ADOPTED under section 3304, shall be exempt from the <
3	provisions of this chapter.
4	§ 3304. Powers and duties.
5	(a) Environmental Quality BoardThe Environmental Quality
6	Board shall promulgate such rules and regulations adopting
7	construction and decommissioning standards such as those
8	utilized by existing county programs RECOMMENDED BY THE AMERICAN <
9	NATIONAL STANDARDS INSTITUTE/NATIONAL GROUND WATER ASSOCIATION
10	or shall promulgate similar construction or decommissioning
11	standards as it deems necessary for the implementation of the
12	provisions of this chapter.
13	(b) Department
14	(1) The department shall develop and implement <
15	procedures as may be necessary and appropriate in order to
16	obtain compliance with this chapter or the rules and
17	regulations promulgated under ENFORCE THE PENALTIES <
18	AUTHORIZED UNDER SECTION 3305 (RELATING TO PENALTIES) AND MAY
19	ISSUE ORDERS OR TAKE SUCH ACTIONS AS MAY BE NECESSARY AND
20	APPROPRIATE TO OBTAIN COMPLIANCE WITH this chapter.
21	(2) (i) The department shall establish and collect <
22	reasonable fees from water well drillers, which fees
23	shall be submitted along with water well completion and
24	decommissioning reports, for administering the provisions
25	<u>of this chapter.</u>
26	(ii) Fees assessed under this section and civil
27	penalties under section 3305 (relating to penalties)
28	(2) CIVIL PENALTIES UNDER SECTION 3305 shall be <
29	deposited into the Safe Drinking Water Fund TO BE USED BY THE <
30	DEPARTMENT TO PROVIDE FOR ANY ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS ASSOCIATED
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1	WITH THIS CHAPTER.
2	(3) The department shall post information on its
3	publicly accessible Internet website regarding private water
4	wells, including the construction and decommissioning
5	standards promulgated under this chapter AND THE TOTAL AMOUNT <
6	OF FINES COLLECTED ANNUALLY AND DEPOSITED INTO THE SAFE
7	DRINKING WATER FUND.
8	(4) The department shall enforce the penalties <
9	authorized under section 3305 and may issue orders or take
10	such actions as may be necessary and appropriate to obtain
11	<u>compliance with this chapter.</u>
12	<u>§ 3305. Penalties.</u>
13	(a) Summary offenseA person who constructs a water well

14 or decommissions an abandoned well in violation of section 3303

(relating to water well construction standards and 15

16 decommissioning of abandoned wells) commits a summary offense

and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not 17

18 more than \$1,000 and, in default thereof, to imprisonment for

19 not more than ten days.

20 (b) Misdemeanor. -- A person previously convicted of a summary

offense under subsection (a) who constructs a water well or 21

causes a water well to be constructed in violation of section 22

23 3303 commits a misdemeanor and shall, upon conviction, be

24 sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$5,000 and, in default

thereof, to imprisonment for not more than three months. 25

26 (c) Failure to file a water well completion or

decommissioning report. -- A water well driller who fails to file 27

28 the report required by this chapter commits a summary offense

29 and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not

more than \$250 and, in default thereof, to imprisonment for not 30

1 more than ten days.

2 <u>§ 3306. CONSTRUCTION.</u>

3 NOTHING IN THIS CHAPTER SHALL BE CONSTRUED TO ALLOW:

(1) THE DEPARTMENT OR THE DEPARTMENT OF CONSERVATION AND 4 NATURAL RESOURCES TO REQUIRE A PERMIT OF ANY KIND FOR THE 5 6 CONSTRUCTION OR THE DECOMMISSIONING OF WATER WELLS IN THIS 7 COMMONWEALTH. 8 (2) THE COMMONWEALTH OR ANY MUNICIPALITY OR ANY AGENCY, 9 AUTHORITY, DEPARTMENT OR DIVISION THEREOF TO METER, CHARGE, TAX OR OTHERWISE IMPOSE A FEE FOR THE USAGE OF PRIVATE WATER 10 WELLS IN THIS COMMONWEALTH. 11 Section 2. This act shall take effect as follows: 12 The addition of 27 Pa.C.S. §§ 3303 and 3305 shall 13 (1)14 take effect on the date regulations under 27 Pa.C.S. § 3304 15 are adopted. The remainder of this act shall take effect in 30 16 (2) 17 days.

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
