## AN ACT

Amending the act of May 17, 1929 (P.L.1798, No.591), entitled "An act providing a fixed charge, payable by the 2 Commonwealth, on lands acquired by the State and the Federal Government for forest reserves, or for the purpose of 3 4 preserving and perpetuating a portion of the original forests 5 of Pennsylvania, and preserving and maintaining the same as 6 public places and parks; and the distribution of the same for county, school, township, and road purposes in the counties, 8 school districts, and townships where such forests are 9 located; and making an appropriation," providing for 10 distribution of timber, wood products and gas and oil ground 11 rentals and royalties. 12 13 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 14 hereby enacts as follows: 15 Section 1. The act of May 17, 1929 (P.L.1798, No.591), referred to as the Forest Reserves Municipal Financial Relief 16 17 Law, is amended by adding a section to read: 18 Section 3. Twenty percent of all revenues received by a 19 State agency, except the Pennsylvania Game Commission and the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission, through the sale of 20

timber and wood products, gas and oil ground rentals and

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- 1 royalties and all other rentals from lands acquired by the
- 2 <u>Commonwealth for the purposes enumerated in section 1, shall,</u>
- 3 within thirty days of receipt of the revenue, be paid to the
- 4 treasurer of the county where the land from which the revenue is
- 5 generated is located. Within thirty days of receiving the
- 6 <u>revenue</u>, the county treasurer shall disburse forty percent of
- 7 the revenue to the school district and thirty percent of the
- 8 <u>revenue to the municipality in which the revenue was generated.</u>
- 9 The treasurer shall retain the remaining thirty percent for the
- 10 benefit of the county.
- 11 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
