AN ACT

1 Amending Title 65 (Public Officers) of the Pennsylvania
2 Consolidated Statutes, further providing for restricted
3 activities.

4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5 hereby enacts as follows:

6 Section 1. Section 1103(f) of Title 65 of the Pennsylvania
7 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:

8 § 1103. Restricted activities.

9 * * *

10 (f) Contract.--

11 (1) No public official or public employee or his spouse
12 or child or any business in which the person or his spouse or
13 child is associated shall enter into any contract valued at
14 \$500 or more with the governmental body with which the public
15 official or public employee is associated or any subcontract
16 valued at \$500 or more with any person who has been awarded a
17 contract with the governmental body with which the public
18 official or public employee is associated unless the contract

1 has been awarded through an open and public process,
2 including prior public notice and subsequent public
3 disclosure of all proposals considered and contracts awarded.
4 In such a case, the public official or public employee shall
5 not have any supervisory or overall responsibility for the
6 implementation or administration of the contract. Any
7 contract or subcontract made in violation of this subsection
8 shall be voidable by a court of competent jurisdiction if the
9 suit is commenced within 90 days of the making of the
10 contract or subcontract.

11 (2) During a publicly elected Statewide officeholder's
12 term of elected office and for a period of five years after
13 leaving that office, the publicly elected Statewide
14 officeholder may not enter into employment agreements, or
15 contracts of any type, with a business or corporation that
16 does business with the Commonwealth.

18 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
