AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," further providing for school police officers; and providing for school security personnel.
7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. Section 778 of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30,
10	No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, amended or
11	added June 25, 1997 (P.L.297, No.30) and July 4, 2004 (P.L.536,
12	No.70), is amended to read:
13	Section 778. School Police Officers(a) Any school
14	district may apply to any judge of the court of common pleas of
15	the county within which the school district is situated to
16	appoint such person or persons as the board of directors of the
17	school district may designate to act as school police officer
18	for said school district. The judge, upon such application, may
19	appoint such person, or so many of them as he may deem proper,

to be such school police officer and shall note the fact of such appointment to be entered upon the records of the court. The judge may, at the request of the school district, grant the school police officer the power to arrest as provided in subsection (c)(2), the authority to issue citations for summary offenses or the authority to detain students until the arrival of local law enforcement, or any combination thereof.

8 (a.1) Any school district which employs a school police 9 officer under this section shall report annually to the 10 Department of Education, Office of Safe Schools, the following 11 information regarding school police officers receiving training 12 as required under 53 Pa.C.S. Ch. 21 Subch. D (relating to 13 municipal police education and training):

14 (1) The identity of the school district and the number of15 school police officers it employs.

16 (2) The municipalities comprising the school district.
17 (3) The date and type of training provided to each school
18 police officer.

(b) Every school police officer so appointed shall, before entering upon the duties of his office, take and subscribe to the oath required by the seventh article of the Constitution, before an alderman or justice of the peace or prothonotary. Such oath shall be filed by the justice of the peace, alderman, or prothonotary among his papers, and a note made upon his docket of the fact of the oath having been taken.

(b.1) Every school police officer who has been granted
powers under subsection (c)(2) or (3) or has been authorized to
carry a firearm must, before entering upon the duties of his
office, successfully complete [training as set forth in 53
Pa.C.S. Ch. 21 Subch. D.] <u>any of the following training:</u>

Such school police officer so appointed shall severally 9 (C) 10 possess and exercise all the following powers and duties: To enforce good order in school buildings, on school 11 (1)buses and on school grounds in their respective school 12 13 districts. For purposes of this clause, the term "school bus" 14 shall include vehicles leased by the school district to 15 transport students and vehicles of mass transit used by students 16 to go to and from school when the school police officer is responding to a report of an incident involving a breach of good 17 18 order or violation of law.

19 (2) If authorized by the court, to exercise the same powers 20 as are now or may hereafter be exercised under authority of law 21 or ordinance by the police of the municipality wherein the 22 school property is located.

(3) If authorized by the court, to issue summary citations
or to detain individuals until local law enforcement is
notified.

(d) Such school police officer shall, when on duty, severally wear a metallic shield or badge with the words "School Police," and the name of the district for which appointed. Such shield shall always be worn in plain view when on duty except when employed as detective.

1 (e) The compensation of such school police officers shall be 2 paid by the school district for which the school police officers 3 are respectively appointed, as may be agreed upon between the 4 board of school directors and the school police officer.

5 (f) School districts and municipalities may enter into 6 cooperative police service agreements pursuant to 42 Pa.C.S. § 7 8953(e) (relating to Statewide municipal police jurisdiction) to 8 authorize the exercise of concurrent jurisdiction with local law 9 enforcement within the municipality where the school or school 10 district is located or within the municipality in which a school 11 event or activity will take place.

12 (g) When acting within the scope of this section, school 13 police officers shall, at all times, be employes of the school 14 district and shall be entitled to all of the rights and benefits 15 accruing therefrom.

16 (h) Nothing in this section shall be construed to preclude a 17 school district from employing <u>or contracting for the provision</u> 18 <u>of services for</u> other security personnel as the school district 19 deems necessary.

Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
<u>Section 778.1.</u> School Security Personnel.--(a) School
