## AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain
- 3 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
- laws relating thereto," further providing for charter
- 6 schools.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. Section 1725-A(a) of the act of March 10, 1949
- 10 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949,
- 11 amended June 29, 2002 (P.L.524, No.88) is amended and the
- 12 section is amended by adding subsections to read:
- 13 Section 1725-A. Funding for Charter Schools. -- (a) Funding
- 14 for a charter school shall be provided in the following manner:
- 15 (1) There shall be no tuition charge for a resident or
- 16 nonresident student attending a charter school.
- 17 (2) For non-special education students, the charter school
- 18 shall receive for each student enrolled the following, which
- 19 shall be paid by the district of residence of each student:
- 20 (i) Through and including the 2012-2013 school year, no less

- 1 than the budgeted total expenditure per average daily membership
- 2 of the prior school year, as defined in section 2501(20), minus
- 3 the budgeted expenditures of the district of residence for
- 4 nonpublic school programs; adult education programs;
- 5 community/junior college programs; student transportation
- 6 services; for special education programs; facilities
- 7 acquisition, construction and improvement services; and other
- 8 financing uses, including debt service and fund transfers as
- 9 provided in the Manual of Accounting and Related Financial
- 10 Procedures for Pennsylvania School Systems established by the
- 11 department. [This amount shall be paid by the district of
- 12 residence of each student.]
- (ii) Beginning in the 2013-2014 school year, the following:
- 14 (A) For each student enrolled in a brick and mortar charter
- 15 school, no less than the budgeted total expenditure per average
- 16 daily membership of the prior school year, as defined in section
- 17 2501(20), minus the budgeted expenditures of the district of
- 18 residence for nonpublic school programs; adult education
- 19 programs; community/junior college programs; student
- 20 transportation services; for special education programs;
- 21 <u>facilities acquisition, construction and improvement services;</u>
- 22 and other financing uses, including debt service and fund
- 23 transfers as provided in the Manual of Accounting and Related
- 24 Financial Procedures for Pennsylvania School Systems established
- 25 by the department.
- 26 (B) For each student enrolled in a cyber charter school, an
- 27 <u>amount equal to the lesser of the median per student cost of</u>
- 28 cyber charter school enrollment paid by all school districts for
- 29 the 2012-2013 school year or the per student cost of cyber
- 30 charter school enrollment paid by the district of residence for

- 1 the 2012-2013 school year, as adjusted by the index pursuant to
- 2 subsection (f).
- 3 (3) For special education students, the charter school shall
- 4 receive for each student enrolled the same funding as for each
- 5 non-special education student as provided in clause (2), plus an
- 6 additional amount determined by dividing the district of
- 7 residence's total special education expenditure by the product
- 8 of multiplying the combined percentage of section 2509.5(k)
- 9 times the district of residence's total average daily membership
- 10 for the prior school year. This amount shall be paid by the
- 11 district of residence of each student.
- 12 (4) A charter school may request the intermediate unit in
- 13 which the charter school is located to provide services to
- 14 assist the charter school to address the specific needs of
- 15 exceptional students. The intermediate unit shall assist the
- 16 charter school and bill the charter school for the services. The
- 17 intermediate unit may not charge the charter school more for any
- 18 service than it charges the constituent districts of the
- 19 intermediate unit.
- 20 (5) Payments shall be made to the charter school in twelve
- 21 (12) equal monthly payments, by the fifth day of each month,
- 22 within the operating school year. A student enrolled in a
- 23 charter school shall be included in the average daily membership
- 24 of the student's district of residence for the purpose of
- 25 providing basic education funding payments and special education
- 26 funding pursuant to Article XXV. If a school district fails to
- 27 make a payment to a charter school as prescribed in this clause,
- 28 the secretary shall deduct the estimated amount, as documented
- 29 by the charter school, from any and all State payments made to
- 30 the district after receipt of documentation from the charter

- 1 school.
- 2 (6) Within thirty (30) days after the secretary makes the
- 3 deduction described in clause (5), a school district may notify
- 4 the secretary that the deduction made from State payments to the
- 5 district under this subsection is inaccurate. The secretary
- 6 shall provide the school district with an opportunity to be
- 7 heard concerning whether the charter school documented that its
- 8 students were enrolled in the charter school, the period of time
- 9 during which each student was enrolled, the school district of
- 10 residence of each student and whether the amounts deducted from
- 11 the school district were accurate.
- 12 \* \* \*
- (f) No later than October 31, 2014, and by October 31 of
- 14 each year thereafter, the department shall calculate the index
- 15 and the adjusted median per student cost of cyber charter school
- 16 enrollment paid by all school districts for use in calculating
- 17 cyber charter school payments for the succeeding school year.
- 18 The department shall publish the index in the Pennsylvania
- 19 Bulletin by November 15, 2014, and by November 15 of each year
- 20 thereafter. Each district of residence shall use the index
- 21 published by the department in calculating the adjustment to the
- 22 per student cost of cyber charter school enrollment paid by the
- 23 district of residence for the 2012-2013 school year pursuant to
- 24 clause (a) (2) (ii) (B).
- 25 (g) As used in this section, the following terms shall have
- 26 the following meanings:
- 27 (1) "Brick and mortar charter school." A charter school as
- 28 defined in section 1703-A which is not a cyber charter school as
- 29 defined in this subsection.
- 30 (2) "Charter school." A brick and mortar charter school or

- 1 <u>a cyber charter school as such terms are defined in this</u>
- 2 subsection.
- 3 (3) "Cyber charter school." A charter school as defined in
- 4 <u>section 1703-A which uses technology in order to provide a</u>
- 5 <u>significant portion of its curriculum and delivers a significant</u>
- 6 portion of its instruction to students through the Internet or
- 7 other electronic means.
- 8 (4) "Index." The index as defined in section 302 of the act
- 9 of June 27, 2006 (1st Sp. Sess., P.L.1873, No.1), known as the
- 10 Taxpayer Relief Act.
- 11 (5) "Median per student cost of cyber charter school
- 12 enrollment paid by all school districts." The midpoint of the
- 13 per student costs for cyber charter school enrollment paid by
- 14 <u>school districts in this Commonwealth, ranked from the lowest</u>
- 15 cost to the highest cost, as determined by the department for
- 16 each school year pursuant to subsection (f).
- 17 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
