AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 30 (Fish) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 2 Statutes, further providing for organization of commission.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Section 301(a) and (c) of Title 30 of the
- 6 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, amended November 1, 2012
- 7 (P.L.1716, No.211), are amended to read:
- 8 § 301. Organization of commission.
- 9 (a) Composition. -- The Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission
- 10 is continued as an independent administrative commission and
- 11 shall consist of ten competent citizens of this Commonwealth who
- 12 shall be appointed by the Governor by and with the advice and
- 13 consent of a majority of the members elected to the Senate for
- 14 terms of [eight] four years and until their successors are
- 15 appointed and qualified.
- 16 * * *
- 17 (c) Terms of office and compensation. -- The members shall
- 18 hold office for terms of [eight] four years and until a

- 1 successor is appointed and qualified. [A member appointed to
- 2 fill a vacancy for a period of four years or less may be
- 3 eligible for appointment to a full eight-year term. A member who
- 4 serves a full eight-year term or fills a vacancy for a period of
- 5 more than four years shall not be eligible for reappointment to
- 6 the commission until a period of eight years expires.] The
- 7 members shall receive no compensation for their services but may
- 8 be reimbursed for travel expenses. When performing any function
- 9 on behalf of the commission or acting within the scope of their
- 10 official duties, members of the commission shall be authorized
- 11 to operate Commonwealth vehicles and watercraft and shall be
- 12 treated as employees of the Commonwealth for the purposes of
- 13 automotive and general liability and the act of June 2, 1915
- 14 (P.L.736, No.338), known as the Workers' Compensation Act.

- 16 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
