1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12 13	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in reimbursement, providing for student achievement education block grant for the 2013-2014 school year and for foundation funding formula; further providing for payments to intermediate units, for payments on account of transportation of nonpublic school pupils, for special education payments to school districts, for payments on account of pupil transportation and for reimbursement of transportation; and establishing the Student Achievement Education Block Grant Fund.
14	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
15	hereby enacts as follows:
16	Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
17	as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding sections
18	to read:
19	Section 2502.52. Student Achievement Education Block Grant
20	for the 2013-2014 School Year(a) For the 2013-2014 school
21	year, the Commonwealth shall pay to each school district from
22	the Student Achievement Education Block Grant Fund, which fund
23	is hereby established in the State Treasury, a student

2	following:
3	(1) An amount equal to the basic education funding
4	allocation for the 2012-2013 school year under section 2502.50.
5	(2) A proportionate share of five hundred four million
6	<u>seven hundred seventy-five thousand dollars (\$504,775,000) based</u>
7	on the payment on account of Social Security for the 2011-2012
8	<u>school year under 24 Pa.C.S. § 8329 (relating to payments on</u>
9	account of social security deductions from appropriations).
10	(3) A proportionate share of five hundred forty-two million
11	<u>two hundred fifty-five thousand dollars (\$542,255,000) based on</u>
12	the sum of the following:
13	(i) The payment on account of pupil transportation
14	allocation for the 2012-2013 school year under section 2541.
15	(ii) The Commonwealth share of payments made on behalf of
16	the school district to intermediate units for the cost of
17	transportation for the 2012-2013 school year under section
18	<u>2509.1.</u>
19	(4) A proportionate share of seventy-seven million six
20	hundred sixty-four thousand dollars (\$77,664,000) based on the
21	payment on account of transportation of nonpublic school pupils
22	under section 2509.3 and transportation of charter school pupils
23	under section 1726-A(a) for the 2012-2013 school year.
24	(b) After payment of the amounts under subsection (a)(1) and
25	section 2509.1(h), if the appropriation is not sufficient to pay
26	the sum of the amounts under subsection (a)(2), (3) and (4), the
27	sum of the amounts under subsection (a)(2), (3) and (4) shall be
28	<u>made on a pro rata basis.</u>
29	Section 2502.53. Foundation Funding FormulaAny revenue
30	deposited in the Student Achievement Education Block Grant Fund
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1 in excess of the amount designated in section 2502.52 shall be

3 (1) Taking the total Statewide average daily membership

4 divided by the total revenue over the base amount.

5 <u>(2) Allocating to each school district the total product in</u> 6 paragraph (1) times the school district's average daily

8 Section 2. Section 2509.1(a), (c.1) and (g) of the act, 9 amended or added June 30, 1995 (P.L.220, No.26) and June 30, 10 2012 (P.L.684, No.82), are amended and the section is amended by 11 adding a subsection to read:

12 Section 2509.1. Payments to Intermediate Units.--(a) Annually through July 2012, before the first day of July, every 13 14 intermediate unit shall submit, for prior review and approval by the Department of Education, an estimate of the cost for 15 16 transportation of pupils to and from classes and schools for exceptional children, and of eligible young children to and from 17 18 early intervention programs, whether or not such classes, 19 schools or programs are conducted by the intermediate unit. [On] 20 Through the 2012-2013 school year, on or before the first day of September, the Commonwealth shall pay to the intermediate unit a 21 22 sum equal to one-half of the approved annual cost of such 23 transportation in the prior year and, on or before the first day 24 of February, shall pay a sum equal to one-quarter of the 25 approved estimated annual cost of such transportation for the 26 current school year, and on or before June 30, the Commonwealth 27 shall pay the remaining quarter adjusted to reflect actual 28 approved cost.

30 (c.1) For the 2011-2012 [and], 2012-2013 <u>and 2013-2014</u> 20130HB0893PN1034 - 3 -

school years, five and one-half percent (5.5%) of the State 1 2 special education appropriation shall be paid to intermediate 3 units on account of special education services. Of this five and one-half percent (5.5%), thirty-five percent (35%) shall be 4 distributed equally among all intermediate units. The remaining 5 sixty-five percent (65%) shall be distributed to each 6 7 intermediate unit in proportion to the number of average daily 8 membership of the component school districts of each 9 intermediate unit as compared to the Statewide total average 10 daily membership.

12 (g) (1) For the 1991-1992 school year and each school year 13 thereafter, for each child enrolled in an intermediate unit 14 class for institutionalized children, the school district in 15 which the child is resident shall pay to the Commonwealth a sum 16 equal to the "tuition charge per elementary pupil" or the 17 "tuition charge per high school pupil," as determined for the 18 schools operated by the district or by a joint board of which 19 the district is a member, for the same year in which the class 20 or school is operated, as provided for in section 2561. In the 21 event that any school district has not established such "tuition charge per elementary pupil" or "tuition charge per high school 22 23 pupil," the Secretary of Education shall fix a reasonable charge 24 for such district for the year in question.

(2) In addition, for each school year through the 2012-2013
<u>school year</u>, the district shall pay to the Commonwealth on
account of transportation by the intermediate unit of pupils to
and from classes and schools for exceptional children and of
eligible young children to and from early intervention programs,
whether or not conducted by the intermediate unit, an amount to

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1 be determined by subtracting from the cost of transportation per 2 pupil the reimbursement due the district on account of such 3 transportation.

In order to facilitate such payments by the several 4 (3) school districts, the Secretary of Education shall withhold from 5 6 any moneys due to such districts out of a State appropriation, 7 except from reimbursements due on account of rentals, the 8 amounts due by such school districts to the Commonwealth. All 9 amounts so withheld are hereby specifically appropriated to the 10 Department of Education for the support of public schools. (h) For the 2013-2014 school year, each intermediate unit 11 12 shall receive a proportionate share of thirty-six million seven 13 hundred sixty-four thousand dollars (\$36,764,000) from the 14 student achievement education block grant appropriation based on the payment under 24 Pa.C.S. § 8329 (relating to payments on 15 16 account of social security deductions from appropriations). 17 Payments shall be made in three (3) installments as follows: 18 (1) In July 2013, an estimate of fifty percent (50%) of the 19 <u>amount due.</u> 20 (2) In January 2014, forty percent (40%) of the amount due. (3) By June 1, 2014, the remaining amount due. 21 22 Section 3. Section 2509.3 of the act, amended June 29, 2002 23 (P.L.524, No.88), is amended to read: 24 Section 2509.3. Payments on Account of Transportation of 25 Nonpublic School Pupils. -- Each school district, regardless of 26 classification, shall be paid by the Commonwealth the sum of 27 thirty-five dollars (\$35) for each nonpublic school pupil 28 transported in the school year 1978-1979 through the school year 29 1983-1984. For the school year 1984-1985 through the school year 1989-1990, each school district shall be paid the sum of seventy 30

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dollars (\$70) for each nonpublic school pupil transported. For 1 2 the school years 1990-1991 and 1991-1992, each school district 3 shall be paid the sum of one hundred twenty-four dollars (\$124) for each nonpublic school pupil transported. For the school year 4 1992-1993 and the 1993-1994 school year, each school district 5 shall be paid the sum of one hundred fifty-nine dollars (\$159) 6 for each nonpublic school pupil transported. For the school year 7 8 1994-1995 through the school year 1996-1997, each school district shall be paid the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200) for 9 10 each nonpublic school pupil transported. For the school year 1997-1998 through the school year 2000-2001, each school 11 district shall be paid the sum of two hundred eighty-five 12 13 dollars (\$285) for each nonpublic school pupil transported. For 14 the school year 2001-2002 [and each] through the school year [thereafter] 2012-2013, each school district shall be paid the 15 16 sum of three hundred eighty-five dollars (\$385) for each nonpublic school pupil transported. 17

Section 4. Section 2509.5(aaa) of the act, amended June 30, 2012 (P.L.684, No.82), is amended to read:

20 Section 2509.5. Special Education Payments to School 21 Districts.--* * *

(aaa) During the 2009-2010 through the [2012-2013] <u>2013-2014</u> school years, each school district shall be paid the amount it received during the 2008-2009 school year under subsection (zz). If insufficient funds are appropriated, the payments shall be made on a pro rata basis.

Section 5. Section 2541(a), (c) introductory paragraph, (d) and (f) of the act, amended November 20, 1979 (P.L.465, No.97), December 21, 1998 (P.L.1194, No.154) and June 30, 2011 (P.L.112, No.24), are amended to read:

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1 Section 2541. Payments on Account of Pupil Transportation .--2 School districts shall be paid by the Commonwealth for (a) 3 every school year through the school year 2012-2013 on account of pupil transportation which, and the means and contracts 4 providing for which, have been approved by the Department of 5 Education, in the cases hereinafter enumerated, an amount to be 6 determined by multiplying the cost of approved reimbursable 7 8 pupil transportation incurred by the district by the district's 9 aid ratio. In determining the formula for the cost of approved 10 reimbursable transportation, the Secretary of Education may prescribe the methods of determining approved mileages and the 11 12 utilized passenger capacity of vehicles for reimbursement 13 purposes. For the school year 1998-1999 [and each school year 14 thereafter] through the school year 2012-2013, any school entity which contracts with one or more school entities to provide 15 16 pupil transportation services shall be reimbursed in accordance 17 with the formula specified by the Department of Education for 18 district-owned vehicles. In addition thereto, the Commonwealth 19 shall pay to each district qualifying a payment for excessive 20 cost of transportation, said amount to be determined by 21 subtracting from the cost of the approved reimbursable transportation the sum of the Commonwealth transportation 22 23 payment immediately above, plus the product of one-half mill 24 (0.0005) times the latest market value of the district as determined by the State Tax Equalization Board, provided such 25 26 amount is not negative. In addition thereto, the Commonwealth 27 shall pay to school districts which own their own vehicles, an 28 annual depreciation charge of ten per centum (10%), to be 29 calculated on the basis of the approved cost at which the 30 district acquired the vehicle for which depreciation is claimed.

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With respect to vehicles purchased prior to January 1, 1956, the 1 2 number of depreciation payments shall be limited to ten such 3 payments. With respect to vehicles purchased on or after January 1, 1956, the annual depreciation charge shall not exceed seven 4 hundred dollars (\$700) for such vehicles. The number of annual 5 depreciation charges shall be limited, so that the total amount 6 of such payments shall not exceed the cost of the vehicle as 7 8 approved by the Department of Education at the time of the 9 purchase. In no case shall the Commonwealth pay, in depreciation 10 charges, more than ten thousand five hundred dollars (\$10,500) 11 for any one vehicle.

13 (c) Payments for pupil transportation on account of the 14 school year 1979-1980 [and every school year thereafter] <u>through</u> 15 <u>the school year 2012-2013</u> shall be made only in the following 16 cases:

18 (d) The Commonwealth shall reimburse the school districts for the school year 1973-1974 [and for each year thereafter] 19 through the school year 2012-2013 for the approved reimbursable 20 costs incurred in providing transportation under section 1361 21 for nonpublic school pupils and under section 1362 for hazardous 22 23 conditions: Provided, however, That no district shall receive 24 less than fifty percent (50%) of such approved reimbursable 25 costs.

(f) Effective for the 2007-2008 school year <u>through the</u> school year 2012-2013, any school district that is required to transport resident students of a distressed school district pursuant to section 1607(b) shall be reimbursed by the

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Commonwealth the additional sum of three hundred eighty-five
 dollars (\$385) for each student reassigned to a school district
 designated pursuant to section 1607.

4 Section 6. This act shall take effect July 1, 2013, or 5 immediately, whichever is later.
