AN ACT
Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, prohibiting mutilation of female genitalia.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
hereby enacts as follows:
Section 1. Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes
is amended by adding a section to read:
§ 3131. Female mutilation.
(a) Offense defined.--A person commits female mutilation
when:
(1) the person knowingly circumcises, excises or infibulates the whole or any part of the genitalia of a female; or
(2) the person is a parent, guardian or other person who
is legally responsible for and charged with the care or custody of a female child 17 years of age or younger, and who allows the circumcision, excision or infibulation of the
whole or any part of the female child's genitalia. (b) Grading.--Female mutilation is a misdemeanor of the
first degree.
(c) Exception.--A surgical operation is not a violation of
this section if such operation is:
(1) necessary to the health of the person on whom it is
performed and either is performed by a licensed physician or
is performed in the presence of a licensed physician by a
person in training to become a licensed physician; or
(2) performed on a person in labor or who has just given
birth and is performed for medical reasons connected with
that labor or birth by a licensed physician, by a licensed
midwife or in the presence of a licensed physician by a
person in training to become a licensed physician.
Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
