AN ACT

1 Designating a bridge on that portion of State Route 263 over the
2 Pennypack Creek, Borough of Hatboro, Montgomery County, as
3 the SP4 Robert Preston Ruttle, Jr., Memorial Bridge.

4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5 hereby enacts as follows:

6 Section 1. SP4 Robert Preston Ruttle, Jr., Memorial Bridge.

7 (a) Findings.--

8 (1) Robert Preston Ruttle, Jr., a resident of Hatboro,
9 Montgomery County, began his tour of duty in Vietnam on
10 November 15, 1968, as a Specialist 4 with the 101st Airborne
11 Division.

12 (2) On June 5, 1969, SP4 Ruttle, age 23, was killed in
13 Quang Tin Province by an enemy explosive device while
14 valiantly serving his country.

15 (b) Designation.--The bridge located on State Route 263,

1 Borough of Hatboro, Montgomery County, over the Pennypack Creek
2 is hereby designated the SP4 Robert Preston Ruttle, Jr.,
3 Memorial Bridge.

4 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
5 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
6 traffic in both directions on the bridge.

7 Section 2. Effective date.

8 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
