AN ACT

Amending the act of December 20, 1985 (P.L.457, No.112), 1 entitled "An act relating to the right to practice medicine 2 and surgery and the right to practice medically related acts; 3 reestablishing the State Board of Medical Education and 4 Licensure as the State Board of Medicine and providing for 5 its composition, powers and duties; providing for the 6 issuance of licenses and certificates and the suspension and 7 revocation of licenses and certificates; providing penalties; 8 and making repeals," providing for the provision of 9 anesthesia care in certain settings; and conferring powers 10 11 and imposing duties on the Department of Health.

4	"Anesthesiologist." A physician who has successfully	
5	completed an approved residency training program in the medical

9	SECTION 1. THE ACT OF DECEMBER 20, 1985 (P.L.457, NO.112),	<
10	KNOWN AS THE MEDICAL PRACTICE ACT OF 1985, IS AMENDED BY ADDING	
11	A SECTION TO READ:	
12	Section 45.1. Provision and supervision of anesthesia care.	
13	<u>(a) General ruleAnesthesia care in a hospital may SHALL</u>	<
14	be provided only by any of the following:	<
15	<u>(1) An anesthesiologist.</u>	
16	<u>(2) A QUALIFIED physician. who is not an</u>	<
17	anesthesiologist and who is privileged by a hospital to	
18	provide anesthesia care upon finding that the physician can	
19	provide all of the following:	
20	(i) The services and procedures commonly employed to	=
21	render a patient insensible to pain for the performance	
22	of surgical, obstetrical or other necessary clinical	
23	procedures.	
24	(ii) Support of life functions during the period of	
25	<u>anesthesia.</u>	
26	(iii) Advanced cardiac life support.	
27	(iv) Appropriate preanesthesia and postanesthesia

7	(3) A physician enrolled in a residency program in	
8	<u>anesthesia or oral surgery.</u>	
9	(4) A DENTIST ANESTHETIST. <	
10	(4) A nurse anesthetist authorized by the State Board of <	
11	Nursing to provide anesthesia care and who is under the	
12	supervision of either or the following:	
13	(5) A NURSE ANESTHETIST AUTHORIZED BY THE STATE BOARD OF <	
14	NURSING TO PROVIDE ANESTHESIA CARE AND WHO IS UNDER THE	
15	SUPERVISION OF EITHER OF THE FOLLOWING:	
16	<u>(i) An individual under paragraph (1) or (2), who is </u> <

19	(b) StudentsA student enrolled in an educational program <	
20	at a school accredited by the Council on Accreditation of	
21	Educational Programs of Nurse Anesthetist of the American	
22	Association of Nurse Anesthetist, as approved by the State Board	
23	of Nursing, may provide supervised anesthesia care if the care	
24	complies with regulations relating to patient safety promulgated	
25	by the Department of Health.	
26	(c) Effect on unrestricted permits. Nothing in this section	
27	shall affect the ability of a dentist anesthetist or of an oral	
28	surgeon who has received an unrestricted permit from the State	
29	Board of Dentistry authorizing the dentist anesthetist or oral	
30	surgeon to administer general anesthesia and deep sedation and	
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1	who is performing the surgery for which the anesthesia is being
2	provided to provide anesthesia care.
3	(d) Delegation. Nothing in this section shall restrict the
4	authority of a physician to delegate the performance of
5	anesthesia services, subject to the criteria and requirements as
6	under section 17 of this act, provided the provision of
7	anesthesia services is supervised by either of the following:
8	(1) An individual under subsection (a)(1) or (2) who is
9	immediately available when needed.
10	(2) The operating surgeon.
11	(e) RegulationsThe Department of Health shall promulgate
12	regulations to implement the provisions of this section.
13	(6) SUPERVISED STUDENT NURSE TRAINEES ENROLLED IN A <
14	COURSE APPROVED BY THE AMERICAN ASSOCIATION OF NURSE
15	ANESTHETISTS.
16	(B) REGULATION NOTHING IN THIS SECTION SHALL AFFECT THE
17	PROVISIONS OF 28 PA. CODE § 123.7 (RELATING TO DENTAL
18	ANESTHETIST AND NURSE ANESTHETIST QUALIFICATIONS). NOTHING IN <
19	THIS SECTION SHALL BE CONSTRUED TO AUTHORIZE THE BOARD TO
20	REGULATE NURSE ANESTHETISTS.
