AN ACT

1	Providing for summaries or copies of patient test results to be
2	sent directly to a patient or the patient's designee when
3	there is a finding of a significant abnormality; and
4	providing for duties of the Department of Health.

5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

6 hereby enacts as follows:

7 Section 1. Short title.

8 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Patient Test

9 Result Information Act.

10 Section 2. Definitions.

11 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall

12 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the

13 context clearly indicates otherwise:

14 "Diagnostic imaging service." A medical test performed on a 15 patient, including any of the following:

16 (1) Magnetic resonance imaging.

19	Section 3.	Test results.
20	(a) Gen	eral ruleAn entity performing a diagnostic imaging
21	service sha	ll send by mail, directly to the patient or the
22	patient's d	esignee, a notice that the diagnostic imaging service
23	has complet	ed a review of the test performed on the patient and
24	has sent re	sults to the physician who ordered the diagnostic
25	imaging ser	vice when there is a finding of a significant
26	abnormality	. The notice shall include all of the following:
27	(1)	The name of the ordering physician.
28	(2)	The date the test was performed.
29	(3)	The date the results were sent to the ordering
30	physicia	n.
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1 (4) The summary of the report, otherwise known as an 2 impression or conclusion, or the complete results of the 3 diagnostic imaging service provided to the ordering 4 physician.

5 (b) Exceptions.--The following shall be exempted from the 6 requirements of subsection (a):

7 (1) Routine obstetrical ultrasounds used to monitor the8 development of a fetus.

9 (2) Diagnostic imaging services performed on a patient 10 who is being treated on an inpatient basis.

11 (c) Test results.--No sooner than seven days and no later 12 than 20 days after the date under subsection (a)(3), the 13 diagnostic imaging service shall provide the patient with the 14 impression, conclusion or report of the results of the 15 diagnostic imaging service performed on the patient.

(d) Method of transmittal.--The notice under subsection (a) and test results under subsection (c) may be provided electronically by e-mail or facsimile if such communication is deemed acceptable by the patient or the patient's designee. Section 4. Duties of Department of Health.

The Department of Health shall, in accordance with law, conduct compliance reviews and investigate complaints filed relating to the requirements of section 3.

24 Section 5. Applicability.

The duties imposed under this act on entities performing diagnostic imaging and the Department of Health shall not commence until sufficient funding has been made available to the department for its duties under section 4 and the department has published a notice to that effect in the Pennsylvania Bulletin. Section 6. Existing professional obligation.

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Nothing in this act shall be construed as relieving a health
care professional from complying with an existing professional
obligation to inform a patient of test results.
Section 7. Effective date.

5 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
