AN ACT

1 2 3	Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further providing for the offense of cruelty to animals.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Section $5511(a)(2.1)(i)$, (c) and (q) of Title 18
7	of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to read:
8	§ 5511. Cruelty to animals.
9	(a) Killing, maiming or poisoning domestic animals or zoo
10	animals, etc
11	* * *
12	(2.1) (i) A person commits a misdemeanor of the first
13	degree if he [willfully] <u>:</u>
14	(A) Willfully and maliciously:
15	[(A)] <u>(I)</u> Kills, maims, mutilates, tortures or
16	disfigures any dog or cat, whether belonging to

1 himself or otherwise. If a person kills, maims, 2 mutilates, tortures or disfigures a dog guide for 3 an individual who is blind, a hearing dog for an individual who is deaf or audibly impaired or a 4 5 service dog for an individual who is physically limited, whether belonging to the individual or 6 7 otherwise, that person, in addition to any other 8 applicable penalty, shall be required to make 9 reparations for veterinary costs in treating the 10 dog and, if necessary, the cost of obtaining and 11 training a replacement dog.

12[(B)] (II) Administers poison to or exposes any13poisonous substance with the intent to administer14such poison to any dog or cat, whether belonging15to himself or otherwise.

16(B) Commits a violation of subsection (c) (1)17that results in the death of the cat or dog.18* * *

19 (c) Cruelty to animals.--

20 (1) A person commits an offense if he wantonly or 21 cruelly illtreats, overloads, beats, otherwise abuses any 22 animal, or neglects any animal as to which he has a duty of 23 care, whether belonging to himself or otherwise, or abandons 24 any animal, or deprives any animal of necessary sustenance, 25 drink, shelter or veterinary care, or access to clean and 26 sanitary shelter which will protect the animal against 27 inclement weather and preserve the animal's body heat and 28 keep it dry.

(2) (i) Except as provided in subparagraph (ii), a
 person convicted of violating paragraph (1) commits a

2 (ii) A person convicted for a second or subsequent 3 time of violating paragraph (1) commits a misdemeanor of 4 the [third] <u>second</u> degree [if all of the following 5 occurred:

6 (A) The action or omission for which the person 7 was convicted for a subsequent time was performed on 8 a dog or cat.

9 (B) The dog or cat was seriously injured, 10 suffered severe physical distress or was placed at 11 imminent risk of serious physical harm as the result 12 of the person's action or omission].

(3) [This subsection shall not apply to activity
 undertaken in normal agricultural operation.] <u>A person</u>
 <u>commits aggravated cruelty to animals when, with no</u>

17 <u>intentionally causes serious physical injury to a companion</u>

18 <u>animal with aggravated cruelty.</u>

19 <u>(4) A person convicted of violating paragraph (3)</u>

20 <u>commits a misdemeanor of the first degree.</u>

21 (5) Nothing contained in this section shall be construed
 22 to prohibit activity undertaken in normal agricultural

23 <u>operation or interfere in any way with anyone lawfully</u>

24 engaged in hunting, trapping or fishing, the dispatch of

25 rabid or diseased animals or the dispatch of animals posing a

26 threat to human safety or other animals, where such action is

27 <u>otherwise legally authorized.</u>

(q) Definitions.--As used in this section, the followingwords and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this

2 <u>"Aggravated cruelty." Conduct which:</u>

3 (1) is intended to cause extreme physical pain; or

4 <u>(2) is done or carried out in an especially depraved or</u> 5 sadistic manner.

6 "Animal fighting." Fighting or baiting any bull, bear, dog,7 cock or other creature.

8 "Audibly impaired." The inability to hear air conduction 9 thresholds at an average of 40 decibels or greater in the better 10 ear.

"Blind." Having a visual acuity of 20/200 or less in the better eye with correction or having a limitation of the field of vision such that the widest diameter of the visual field subtends an angular distance not greater than 20 degrees. "Conveyance." A truck, tractor, trailer or semitrailer, or any combination of these, propelled or drawn by mechanical power.

18 "Deaf." Totally impaired hearing or hearing with or without 19 amplification which is so seriously impaired that the primary 20 means of receiving spoken language is through other sensory 21 input, including, but not limited to, lip reading, sign 22 language, finger spelling or reading.

"Domestic animal." Any dog, cat, equine animal, bovineanimal, sheep, goat or porcine animal.

25 "Domestic fowl." Any avis raised for food, hobby or sport.
26 "Equine animal." Any member of the Equidae family, which
27 includes horses, asses, mules, ponies and zebras.

28 "Normal agricultural operation." Normal activities,
29 practices and procedures that farmers adopt, use or engage in
30 year after year in the production and preparation for market of

1 poultry, livestock and their products in the production and 2 harvesting of agricultural, agronomic, horticultural, 3 silvicultural and aquicultural crops and commodities. 4 "Physically limited." Having limited ambulation, including, 5 but not limited to, a temporary or permanent impairment or 6 condition that causes an individual to use a wheelchair or walk

7 with difficulty or insecurity, affects sight or hearing to the 8 extent that an individual is insecure or exposed to danger, 9 causes faulty coordination or reduces mobility, flexibility, 10 coordination or perceptiveness.

"Zoo animal." Any member of the class of mammalia, aves, amphibia or reptilia which is kept in a confined area by a public body or private individual for purposes of observation by the general public.

15 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
