AN ACT

Designating a portion of County Line Road separating Montgomery County and Bucks County as the SP4 Ronald C. Smith Memorial Highway; DESIGNATING A PORTION OF PENNSYLVANIA ROUTE 233 FROM <--THE NORTHERN CORPORATE LIMITS OF NEWVILLE BOROUGH TO THE CUMBERLAND COUNTY AND PERRY COUNTY LINE AS THE SERGEANT 5 TIMOTHY L. HAYSLETT MEMORIAL HIGHWAY; AND DESIGNATING A <--BRIDGE ON THAT PORTION OF US 22/US 322 EASTBOUND OVER INTERSTATE 81, SUSQUEHANNA TOWNSHIP, DAUPHIN COUNTY, AS THE 8 CHIEF WARRANT OFFICER MATTHEW RUFFNER MEMORIAL BRIDGE+; 9 DESIGNATING A PORTION OF PENNSYLVANIA ROUTE 12 IN ALSACE 10 TOWNSHIP, BERKS COUNTY, AS THE SPECIAL WARFARE OPERATOR CHIEF 11 12 (SEAL) LANCE M. VACCARO HIGHWAY; AND DESIGNATING THE BRIDGE 13 ON STATE ROUTE 3023, JOHNS ROAD, JOHNSTOWN, CAMBRIA COUNTY, AS THE CLARA BARTON MEMORIAL BRIDGE. 14 15 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 16 hereby enacts as follows: 17 Section 1. SP4 Ronald C. Smith Memorial Highway. 18 (a) Findings. --19 SP4 Ronald Carlton Smith was a resident of Hatboro, (1)

Pennsylvania, before enlisting in the United States Army on

- 1 December 6, 1967, at 23 years of age.
- 2 (2) SP4 Smith was assigned to Troop E, 1st Cavalry, 11th
- 3 Infantry Brigade, Americal Division of the United States Army
- 4 in Vietnam.
- 5 (3) SP4 Smith served as an Armor Reconnaissance
- 6 Specialist, gathering intelligence on terrain features;
- 7 scouting enemy force strength and locations; driving armored,
- 8 tracked and wheeled vehicles and engaging in tactical
- 9 operations against enemy troops.
- 10 (4) While valiantly serving his country, SP4 Smith was
- 11 killed by an explosive device on April 14, 1968, in the Quang
- 12 Ngai Province of South Vietnam.
- 13 (b) Designation. -- The section of County Line Road separating
- 14 Montgomery and Bucks Counties from Maple Avenue to Easton Road
- 15 is hereby designated the SP4 Ronald C. Smith Memorial Highway.
- 16 (c) Signs.---The Department of Transportation shall erect
- 17 and maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the
- 18 highway to traffic in both directions on the highway.
- 19 SECTION 2. SERGEANT TIMOTHY L. HAYSLETT MEMORIAL HIGHWAY.
- 20 (A) FINDINGS AND DECLARATIONS. -- THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS
- 21 AND DECLARES AS FOLLOWS:
- 22 (1) TIMOTHY L. HAYSLETT WAS BORN MAY 17, 1977, IN
- 23 WINSTON-SALEM, NORTH CAROLINA. HE MOVED TO NEWVILLE,
- 24 PENNSYLVANIA, IN CUMBERLAND COUNTY ALONG WITH HIS FAMILY IN
- 25 1983. HE ATTENDED BIG SPRING HIGH SCHOOL IN NEWVILLE AND
- 26 ENTERED THE UNITED STATES ARMY IN 1995 WHERE HE SERVED FOR
- 27 EIGHT YEARS.
- 28 (2) SERGEANT HAYSLETT WAS ASSIGNED TO THE HEADQUARTERS
- 29 AND HEADQUARTERS COMPANY, 1ST BATTALION, 37TH ARMORED
- 30 REGIMENT, 1ST ARMORED DIVISION AT FRIEDBERG, GERMANY. HE DIED

- 1 NOVEMBER 15, 2003, AT 26 YEARS OF AGE WHILE ON PATROL IN
- 2 BAGHDAD, IRAQ, WHEN AN IMPROVISED EXPLOSIVE DEVICE STRUCK HIS
- 3 HUMVEE.
- 4 (3) SERGEANT HAYSLETT WAS AWARDED THE PURPLE HEART AND
- 5 THE BRONZE STAR MEDAL FOR HIS WOUNDS SUSTAINED IN COMBAT
- 6 AGAINST AN ENEMY OF THE UNITED STATES. HE WAS ALSO AWARDED
- 7 THE GOOD CONDUCT MEDAL, THE NATIONAL DEFENSE SERVICE MEDAL,
- 8 THE GLOBAL WAR ON TERROR SERVICE MEDAL AND THE IRAQ CAMPAIGN
- 9 MEDAL WITH TWO BRONZE SERVICE STARS.
- 10 (4) SERGEANT TIMOTHY HAYSLETT, THE BELOVED SON OF GUY L.
- 11 AND MARY D. HAYSLETT OF NEWVILLE, PA, WAS COURAGEOUSLY
- 12 SERVING HIS COUNTRY AT THE TIME OF HIS DEATH, AND HIS
- 13 EXCELLENCE AS A SOLDIER HAS BEEN EXTOLLED BY MANY.
- 14 (B) DESIGNATION.--THE SECTION OF PENNSYLVANIA ROUTE 233 FROM
- 15 THE NORTHERN CORPORATE LIMITS OF NEWVILLE BOROUGH TO THE
- 16 CUMBERLAND COUNTY AND PERRY COUNTY LINE IS HEREBY DESIGNATED AS
- 17 THE SERGEANT TIMOTHY L. HAYSLETT MEMORIAL HIGHWAY.
- 18 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
- 19 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE HIGHWAY TO
- 20 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE HIGHWAY.
- 21 SECTION 3. CHIEF WARRANT OFFICER MATTHEW RUFFNER MEMORIAL
- BRIDGE.
- 23 (A) FINDINGS.--
- 24 (1) CHIEF WARRANT OFFICER (CWO) MATTHEW RUFFNER WAS A
- 25 RESIDENT OF SUSQUEHANNA TOWNSHIP, DAUPHIN COUNTY,
- 26 PENNSYLVANIA.
- 27 (2) CWO RUFFNER WAS A PILOT AND A SENIOR FLIGHT
- 28 INSTRUCTOR AT FORT INDIANTOWN GAP.
- 29 (3) WHILE BRAVELY SERVING HIS COUNTRY, CWO RUFFNER WAS
- 30 KILLED IN AFGHANISTAN ON APRIL 9, 2013, IN A HELICOPTER

- 1 CRASH.
- 2 (B) DESIGNATION.--THE BRIDGE LOCATED ON US 22/US 322
- 3 EASTBOUND OVER INTERSTATE 81 IN SUSOUEHANNA TOWNSHIP, DAUPHIN
- 4 COUNTY, IS HEREBY DESIGNATED THE CHIEF WARRANT OFFICER MATTHEW
- 5 RUFFNER MEMORIAL BRIDGE.
- 6 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
- 7 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE BRIDGE TO
- 8 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE BRIDGE.
- 9 SECTION 4. SPECIAL WARFARE OPERATOR CHIEF (SEAL) LANCE M. <--
- 10 VACCARO HIGHWAY.
- 11 (A) FINDINGS. -- THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES AS
- 12 FOLLOWS:
- 13 (1) SPECIAL WARFARE OPERATOR CHIEF (SEAL) LANCE M.
- 14 VACCARO WAS BORN IN READING IN 1972 AND WAS RAISED AND LIVED
- 15 IN ALSACE TOWNSHIP FROM 1973 UNTIL 1987, ATTENDING THE OLEY
- 16 VALLEY SCHOOL DISTRICT PUBLIC SCHOOLS.
- 17 (2) SPECIAL WARFARE OPERATOR CHIEF LANCE M. VACCARO
- 18 GRADUATED FROM OLEY VALLEY HIGH SCHOOL IN 1990 AND AFTER
- 19 STUDYING BRIEFLY AT KUTZTOWN UNIVERSITY ENLISTED IN THE
- 20 UNITED STATES NAVY IN 1991.
- 21 (3) AFTER SERVING ABOARD THE U.S.S. GEORGE WASHINGTON
- 22 AND U.S.S. KITTY HAWK, SPECIAL WARFARE OPERATOR CHIEF LANCE
- 23 M. VACCARO BECAME A MEMBER OF THE UNITED STATES NAVY'S ELITE
- 24 SEALS IN 1997 AND SUBSEQUENTLY WAS DEPLOYED ON OVERSEAS
- 25 MISSIONS IN KOSOVO, AFGHANISTAN AND IRAO.
- 26 (4) SPECIAL WARFARE OPERATOR CHIEF LANCE M. VACCARO DIED
- 27 DURING A TRAINING MISSION IN THE UNITED STATES IN 2008.
- 28 (5) SPECIAL WARFARE OPERATOR CHIEF LANCE M. VACCARO'S
- 29 AWARDS INCLUDE THE NAVY AND MARINE CORPS COMMENDATION MEDAL,
- 30 ARMY COMMENDATION MEDAL, JOINT SERVICE ACHIEVEMENT MEDAL,

- 1 FOUR NAVY AND MARINE CORPS ACHIEVEMENT MEDALS, TWO COMBAT
- 2 ACTION RIBBONS, PRESIDENTIAL UNIT CITATION, NAVY UNIT
- 3 COMMENDATION, ARMED FORCES EXPEDITIONARY MEDAL, KOSOVO
- 4 CAMPAIGN MEDAL, AFGHANISTAN CAMPAIGN MEDAL, IRAQ CAMPAIGN
- 5 MEDAL, GLOBAL WAR ON TERRORISM SERVICE MEDAL, GLOBAL WAR ON
- 6 TERRORISM EXPEDITIONARY MEDAL AND ARMED FORCES SERVICE MEDAL.
- 7 (6) SPECIAL WARFARE OPERATOR CHIEF LANCE M. VACCARO IS
- 8 SURVIVED BY HIS PARENTS, JOSEPH AND CHRISTINE L. VACCARO.
- 9 (B) DESIGNATION.--THE SECTION OF PENNSYLVANIA ROUTE 12 IN
- 10 ALSACE TOWNSHIP, BERKS COUNTY, IS HEREBY DESIGNATED THE SPECIAL
- 11 WARFARE OPERATOR CHIEF (SEAL) LANCE M. VACCARO HIGHWAY.
- 12 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
- 13 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE HIGHWAY TO
- 14 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE HIGHWAY.
- 15 SECTION 5. CLARA BARTON MEMORIAL BRIDGE.
- 16 (A) FINDINGS.--
- 17 (1) IN 1882, AFTER YEARS OF WORK, PIONEER NURSE CLARA
- 18 BARTON'S ORGANIZATION, THE AMERICAN NATIONAL RED CROSS, WAS
- 19 OFFICIALLY ESTABLISHED.
- 20 (2) ON JUNE 5, 1889, APPROXIMATELY FIVE DAYS AFTER THE
- 21 SOUTH FORK DAM BROKE IN JOHNSTOWN, PENNSYLVANIA, CLARA BARTON
- 22 AND A GROUP OF RED CROSS VOLUNTEERS RODE THE TRAIN TO THE
- 23 DEVASTATED TOWN TO HELP THE SURVIVORS IN ONE OF THE FIRST
- 24 MAJOR DISASTER RESPONSES FOR THE ORGANIZATION.
- 25 (3) CLARA BARTON AND THE RED CROSS REMAINED IN THE TOWN
- 26 FOR MORE THAN FIVE MONTHS AND PROVIDED AID TO MORE THAN
- 27 25,000 PEOPLE BY ESTABLISHING FEEDING STATIONS, BUILDING
- 28 SHELTERS AND RENDERING MEDICAL CARE.
- 29 (4) CLARA BARTON CONTINUED HER WORK WITH THE RED CROSS
- 30 HELPING OTHERS DURING TIMES OF DISASTER UNTIL HER RESIGNATION

- 1 IN 1904 AT 83 YEARS OF AGE. SHE DIED APRIL 12, 1912, AT 90
- 2 YEARS OF AGE.
- 3 (B) DESIGNATION. -- THE BRIDGE LOCATED ON STATE ROUTE 3023,
- 4 JOHNS STREET, OVER LITTLE CONEMAUGH RIVER IN JOHNSTOWN, CAMBRIA
- 5 COUNTY IS HEREBY DESIGNATED THE CLARA BARTON MEMORIAL BRIDGE.
- 6 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
- 7 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE BRIDGE TO
- 8 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE BRIDGE.
- 9 Section 246. Effective date.
- 10 This act shall take effect immediately. AS FOLLOWS: <--
- 11 (1) SECTION 3 SHALL TAKE EFFECT IN 60 DAYS.
- 12 (2) THE REMAINDER OF THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT
- 13 IMMEDIATELY.
