17	Section 1. Section 1001 of the act of July 23, 1970
18	(P.L.563, No.195), known as the Public Employe Relations Act, is

20	Section 1001. Strikes by <u>employes of the Southeastern</u>
21	<u>Pennsylvania Transportation Authority (SEPTA),</u> guards at prisons
22	or mental hospitals, or employes directly involved with and
23	necessary to the functioning of the courts of this Commonwealth
24	are prohibited at any time. If a strike occurs the public

1 employer shall forthwith initiate in the court of common pleas of the jurisdiction where the strike occurs, an action for 2 appropriate equitable relief including but not limited to 3 injunctions. If the strike involves Commonwealth employes, the 4 chief legal officer of the public employer or the Attorney 5 General where required by law shall institute an action for 6 equitable relief, either in the court of common pleas of the 7 jurisdiction where the strike has occurred or the Commonwealth 8 9 Court.

10 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
