AN ACT

1 Amending the act of August 26, 1971 (P.L.351, No.91), entitled
2 "An act providing for a State Lottery and administration
3 thereof; authorizing the creation of a State Lottery
4 Commission; prescribing its powers and duties; disposition of
5 funds; violations and penalties therefor; exemption of prizes
6 from State and local taxation and making an appropriation,"
7 further providing for powers and duties of secretary AND FOR <--
8 REPORT.

9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
10 hereby enacts as follows:

11 ~~Section 1. Section 303(a)(11)(iv) of the act of August 26, <--~~
12 ~~1971 (P.L.351, No.91), known as the State Lottery Law, amended~~
13 ~~June 30, 2011 (P.L.110, No.23), is amended to read:~~

14 SECTION 1. SECTIONS 303(A)(11)(IV) AND 315 OF THE ACT OF <--
15 AUGUST 26, 1971 (P.L.351, NO.91), KNOWN AS THE STATE LOTTERY
16 LAW, AMENDED OR ADDED JUNE 30, 2011 (P.L.110, NO.23), ARE
17 AMENDED TO READ:

18 Section 303. Powers and duties of secretary.

19 (a) Powers and duties enumerated.--In addition to the powers
20 and duties provided by law and the act of April 9, 1929

1 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, the
2 secretary shall have the power and it shall be his duty to
3 operate and administer the lottery, and to promulgate rules and
4 regulations governing the establishment and operation thereof,
5 including, but not limited to:

6 * * *

7 (11) The apportionment of the total revenues accruing
8 from the sale of lottery tickets or shares and from all other
9 sources among:

10 * * *

11 (iv) for property tax relief and free or reduced
12 fare transit service for the elderly as provided in
13 section 311. For fiscal years beginning before July 1,
14 [2015] 2014, no less than 27% of the total revenues <--
15 accruing from the sale of lottery tickets or shares shall
16 be dedicated to this subparagraph. For fiscal years
17 beginning after June 30, [2015] 2014, no less than [30%] <--
18 25% of the total revenues accruing from the sale of
19 lottery tickets or shares shall be dedicated to this
20 subparagraph.

22 SECTION 315. REPORT. <--

23 THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE
24 GOVERNOR, THE CHAIRMAN AND MINORITY CHAIRMAN OF THE
25 APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE OF THE SENATE, THE CHAIRMAN AND
26 MINORITY CHAIRMAN OF THE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE OF THE HOUSE
27 OF REPRESENTATIVES, THE CHAIRMAN AND MINORITY CHAIRMAN OF THE
28 AGING AND YOUTH COMMITTEE OF THE SENATE [AND], THE CHAIRMAN AND
29 MINORITY CHAIRMAN OF THE AGING AND OLDER ADULT SERVICES
30 COMMITTEE OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, THE CHAIRMAN AND

1 MINORITY CHAIRMAN OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE OF THE SENATE AND THE
2 CHAIRMAN AND MINORITY CHAIRMAN OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE OF THE
3 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES BY [JUNE 1] SEPTEMBER 1 OF EACH YEAR.
4 THE REPORT SHALL SET FORTH CURRENT LOTTERY PROFITS AND THE STATE
5 LOTTERY'S PLAN FOR INCREASING FUTURE PROFITS. THIS REPORT SHALL
6 BE POSTED ON THE DEPARTMENT'S PUBLICLY ACCESSIBLE INTERNET
7 WEBSITE. [THIS SECTION SHALL EXPIRE JUNE 30, 2015.]

8 Section 2. This act shall take effect ~~in 60 days~~
9 IMMEDIATELY.
