9	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
10	hereby enacts as follows:
11	Section 1. The act of November 24, 1998 (P.L.882, No.111),
12	known as the Crime Victims Act, is amended by adding a section
13	to read:
14	Section 5101.1. Disclosure and confidentiality of victims'
15	records.
16	All records pertaining to a victim in the possession of or
17	maintained by the Office of Victim Advocate, including
18	information regarding a victim's current contact information and
19	any other information or record relating thereto, are the
20	property of the Office of Victim Advocate, shall be kept

1	confidential and shall not be subject to the provisions of the
2	act of February 14, 2008 (P.L.6, No.3), known as the Right-To-
3	Know Law. Victim information and records relating to a victim
4	contained in the database or maintained in relation thereto may
5	be released by the Office of Victim Advocate to a State or local
6	government agency that has a duty or need to maintain contact
7	with the victim but shall not be disclosed to any other person
8	without the written consent of the victim.
9	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
