8	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
9	hereby enacts as follows:
10	Section 1. Section 1333(a)(1) of the act of March 10, 1949
11	(P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949,
12	amended November 17, 1995 (1st Sp.Sess., P.L.1110, No.29), is
13	amended to read:
14	Section 1333. Penalties for Violation of Compulsory
15	Attendance Requirements(a) (1) Every parent, guardian, or
16	person in parental relation, having control or charge of any
17	child or children of compulsory school age, who shall
18	intentionally fail to comply with the provisions of this act
19	regarding compulsory attendance, shall on summary conviction

thereof, be sentenced to [pay a fine, for the benefit of the 1 2 school district in which such offending person resides, not 3 exceeding three hundred dollars (\$300) and to pay court costs or be sentenced to] complete a parenting education program offered 4 and operated by a local school district, medical institution or 5 other community resources, or perform community service. [, and, 6 in default of the payment of such fine and costs or completion 7 8 of the parenting program by the person so offending, shall be sentenced to the county jail for a period not exceeding five (5) 9 10 days. Any person sentenced to pay any such fine may appeal to 11 the court of common pleas of the proper county, upon entering 12 into a recognizance, with one or more proper sureties, in double 13 the amount of penalty and costs.] Before any proceedings are 14 instituted against any parent, guardian, or person in parental 15 relation, for failure to comply with the provisions of this act, 16 the district superintendent, attendance officer, or secretary of 17 the board of school directors, shall give the offending person 18 three (3) days' written notice of such violation. If, after such 19 notice has been given, the provisions of this act regarding 20 compulsory attendance are again violated by the persons so notified, at any time during the term of compulsory attendance, 21 such person, so again offending, shall be liable under the 22 23 provisions of this section without further notice.
