AN ACT

1 Designating a portion of Pennsylvania Route 611 between Maple
2 Avenue and Meetinghouse Road, in Montgomery County, as the
3 Lieutenant Joseph C. Park II Memorial Highway.

4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5 hereby enacts as follows:

6 Section 1. Lieutenant Joseph C. Park II Memorial Highway.

7 (a) Findings.--

8 (1) Lt. Park was born August 31, 1946, and lived in
9 Horsham, Pennsylvania.

10 (2) Lt. Park attended Hatboro-Horsham High School and
11 Valley Forge Military Academy before briefly attending The
12 Pennsylvania State University.

13 (3) Lt. Park was a member of the polo team at the Valley
14 Forge Military Academy and attained the rank of Eagle Scout.

15 (4) Lt. Park proudly and courageously served in the
16 United States Army during the Vietnam War.

1 (5) Lt. Park was killed in Vietnam on March 28, 1968,
2 from a hostile gunshot wound.

3 (6) Lt. Park was awarded the Purple Heart, National
4 Defense Medal, and Republic of Vietnam Service Medal for his
5 military service.

6 (b) Designation.--The portion of Pennsylvania Route 611 in
7 Montgomery County, between Maple Avenue and Meetinghouse Road,
8 is hereby designated as the Lieutenant Joseph C. Park II
9 Memorial Highway.

10 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
11 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the highway to
12 traffic in both directions on the highway.

13 Section 2. Effective date.

14 This act shall take effect immediately.
