## AN ACT

- Amending the act of June 23, 1931 (P.L.932, No.317), entitled
  "An act relating to cities of the third class; and amending, revising, and consolidating the law relating thereto," in the
- 4 city treasurer, further providing for depositories of city
- funds entrusted to the treasurer by city council.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. Section 1406 of the act of June 23, 1931
- 9 (P.L.932, No.317), known as The Third Class City Code, reenacted
- 10 and amended June 28, 1951 (P.L.662, No.164) and amended March
- 11 19, 2014 (P.L.52, No.22), is amended to read:
- 12 Section 1406. Depositories of City Funds Entrusted to the
- 13 Treasurer by City Council. -- The treasurer shall keep the public
- 14 funds in banks or financial depositories as council may direct,
- 15 under restrictions and safeguards as council may provide, and
- 16 shall verify the treasurer's accounts whenever required, to the
- 17 satisfaction of council. <u>Taxes</u>, <u>fees</u>, <u>assessments or other</u>
- 18 charges may not be payable to an account that is in or includes
- 19 an individual's name, but may be payable to an account that

- 1 <u>includes the name of an office, title or position.</u>
- 2 No treasurer complying with the provisions of this section
- 3 and any ordinance of the city, nor the treasurer's surety or
- 4 sureties, shall be chargeable with losses of city funds caused
- 5 by the insolvency or negligence of any city depositories.
- 6 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
