A RESOLUTION

1 Commemorating July 27, 2013, as "Korean War Veterans Armistice
2 Day."

3 WHEREAS, July 27, 2013, marks the 60th anniversary of the
4 signing of the Korean War Armistice; and

5 WHEREAS, In an effort to remove the title "the Forgotten War"
6 from this bloody conflict, it is fitting to honor the men and
7 women who served our country during the Korean War, including
8 the tens of thousands of Americans who died, were wounded or are
9 still missing in action; and

10 WHEREAS, Many veterans and former prisoners of war continue
11 to serve us today in our communities; and

12 WHEREAS, The Korean War was the United States' first direct
13 conflict with communist forces in the Cold War and the first

1 deployment of troops to a combat zone to contain communism; and

2 WHEREAS, The battles were brutal and our forces fought in
3 terrible conditions with the utmost amount of bravery and
4 courage; therefore be it

5 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives commemorate July
6 27, 2013, as "Korean War Veterans Armistice Day;" and be it
7 further

8 RESOLVED, That local governments and the communities
9 throughout this Commonwealth be encouraged to conduct
10 appropriate "Korean War Veterans Armistice Day" observances to
11 ensure that their many sacrifices are not forgotten.
