A RESOLUTION

Directing the Joint State Government Commission to study the 1 issue of childhood obesity, to establish an advisory 2 committee to conduct a comprehensive study of childhood obesity, to propose strategies for healthier eating and physical activity for children and to report to the House of 5 Representatives with its findings, recommendations and 6 legislation. 7 8 WHEREAS, Research studies have found that childhood obesity has reached epidemic proportions in the United States; and 10 WHEREAS, More than 23 million children, approximately one in 11 every three, are either obese or overweight; and 12 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Department of Health reports that 13 32.6% of children in kindergarten through grade six and 34.1% of children in grades seven through twelve are overweight or obese; 14 15 and 16 WHEREAS, Obese children are more likely to have a variety of 17 dangerous health conditions, including high blood pressure and 18 cholesterol, breathing problems such as sleep apnea and asthma 19 and joint and musculoskeletal discomfort; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Obese children are more likely to be obese as adults
- 2 with the potential for other serious health conditions, such as
- 3 heart disease, diabetes and some types of cancer; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Childhood obesity has been demonstrated to span
- 5 gender, socioeconomic status, race and age; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Two of the most common modifiable risk factors for
- 7 childhood obesity are unhealthy diet and physical inactivity;
- 8 therefore be it
- 9 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the Joint
- 10 State Government Commission to establish an advisory committee
- 11 of 25 members consisting of representatives from the Department
- 12 of Agriculture, Department of Education, Department of Health,
- 13 child and school health and nutrition professionals, a
- 14 pediatrician, a health and physical education teacher, a school
- 15 nurse and representatives from not-for-profit organizations and
- 16 associations whose missions include the promotion of healthy
- 17 living initiatives; and be it further
- 18 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission, working
- 19 with the advisory committee, conduct a thorough and
- 20 comprehensive study of childhood obesity in this Commonwealth,
- 21 including any existing obesity prevention and wellness
- 22 strategies; and be it further
- 23 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission, working
- 24 with the advisory committee, study and report on regulatory and
- 25 statutory initiatives and best practices in other states as well
- 26 as any studies or initiatives promoted by the Centers for
- 27 Disease Control and Prevention or other national research
- 28 organizations; and be it further
- 29 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission may, as
- 30 it deems necessary, hold informational meetings to receive

- 1 testimony from professionals or organizations with expertise in
- 2 childhood obesity or healthy living strategies; and be it
- 3 further
- 4 RESOLVED, That the final report include findings of fact,
- 5 recommendations for additional strategies and policies with the
- 6 goal of preventing childhood obesity and legislation supporting
- 7 any one or more of the proposed recommendations; and be it
- 8 further
- 9 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission issue a
- 10 report to the House of Representatives with its findings and
- 11 recommendations not later than 12 months from the date of
- 12 adoption of this resolution.
