## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging the President of the United States and Congress to 2 support the adoption of H.R. 1014.
- 3 WHEREAS, Approximately 1,800 Pennsylvania National Guard
- 4 Military Technicians may be subject to furlough as a result of
- 5 budgetary sequestration; and
- 6 WHEREAS, It is critical that the Pennsylvania National Guard
- 7 maintain training and readiness to ensure that the National
- 8 Guard is ready to answer the call when needed for domestic
- 9 operations; and
- 10 WHEREAS, All the military components are scrambling to absorb
- 11 \$47 billion in cuts throughout the Department of Defense,
- 12 including the furloughs of 800,000 civilian employees; and
- 13 WHEREAS, There is one group that justifies an exemption from
- 14 the cuts, National Guard Military Technicians; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The Pentagon exempted uniformed personnel from
- 16 sequestration to limit the impact of ongoing budget debates on
- 17 military readiness; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The Department of Defense, however, did not include
- 2 the approximately 53,000 National Guard Military Technicians
- 3 within the exemption; and
- WHEREAS, There are 1,800 military technicians in
- 5 Pennsylvania; and
- 6 WHEREAS, These military technicians support the readiness for
- 7 troops in preparation not only for State emergencies but for
- 8 Federal missions as well; and
- 9 WHEREAS, H.R. 1014 is a bill that would exempt military
- 10 technicians from sequestration by including them in military
- 11 personnel accounts now and in the future; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The President of the United States, Congress and the
- 13 Department of Defense all agreed to exempt uniformed personnel
- 14 from sequestration to limit the impact on military readiness;
- 15 and
- 16 WHEREAS, The furlough of military technicians violates that
- 17 intent; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania National Guard does not desire to
- 19 furlough any military technicians if this can be avoided,
- 20 however, further congressional action is required to ensure no
- 21 furloughs are necessary nationwide for National Guard Military
- 22 Technicians and for Pennsylvania specifically now and in the
- 23 future; therefore be it
- 24 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge the
- 25 President of the United States and Congress to support the
- 26 adoption of H.R. 1014; and be it further
- 27 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
- 28 the President of the United States and to the presiding officers
- 29 of each house of Congress and to each member of Congress from
- 30 Pennsylvania.
