- 7 WHEREAS, A well-educated work force is vital to the economic
- 8 well-being of the United States and of this Commonwealth; and
- 9 WHEREAS, A good education leads to more skilled and higher
- 10 paying jobs; and
- 11 WHEREAS, This Commonwealth has a strong and historic
- 12 tradition of commitment to public education and has been blessed
- 13 with the leadership of brilliant and innovative educators;

- 2 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
