A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the month of September 2013 as "Hunger Action Month" 2 in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, September 2013 has been designated as "Hunger Action
- 4 Month" to provide an opportunity for communities in the United
- 5 States to unite to focus attention on the persistent problem of
- 6 domestic hunger; and
- 7 WHEREAS, For one in eight Pennsylvanians, hunger is a
- 8 reality; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Many United States households experience hunger, and
- 10 some people in these households frequently skip meals or eat too
- 11 little, sometimes going without food for a whole day; and
- 12 WHEREAS, In 2012, 14.5% of United States households were food
- 13 insecure (17.6 million households), meaning their access to
- 14 enough food is limited by a lack of money and other resources,

- 1 which remains at nearly the highest recorded prevalence rate of
- 2 food insecurity since 1995 when the first national food security
- 3 survey was conducted; and
- 4 WHEREAS, In 2012, nearly 1.6 million Pennsylvanians were food
- 5 insecure; and
- 6 WHEREAS, In 2011, 20% of Pennsylvania's children experienced
- 7 food insecurity; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Members of these households have lower-quality diets
- 9 or must resort to seeking emergency food because they cannot
- 10 always afford the food they need; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The costs of other essentials, such as home heating,
- 12 gasoline, housing and medical care, have increased
- 13 significantly, and for families caught in the squeeze between
- 14 declining wages and rising costs, the food budget becomes a
- 15 frequent pressure point; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Utilization of emergency food assistance becomes a
- 17 way for these families to keep food on the table while still
- 18 paying the bills; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Food banks, food rescue organizations, soup
- 20 kitchens, food pantries, faith-based organizations, businesses
- 21 and individuals are donating time, raising funds and giving food
- 22 to help their neighbors; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Individuals benefiting from the availability of
- 24 donated food range from infants and toddlers, school-age
- 25 children and adolescents to single mothers, single fathers, two-
- 26 parent families, veterans and their families and seniors; and
- 27 WHEREAS, Research shows that preschool and school-age
- 28 children who experience severe hunger have higher levels of
- 29 chronic illness, anxiety and depression and behavioral problems
- 30 than children with no hunger; therefore be it

- 1 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 2 month of September 2013 as "Hunger Action Month" in
- 3 Pennsylvania.
