- Designating October 26, 2013, as "Make a Difference Day" in Pennsylvania.

- 5 WHEREAS, Connecting with others and working together through
- 6 volunteer service bridges differences separating people and help
- 7 solve serious social problems; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Philanthropy and volunteerism are an American
- 9 tradition; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Millions of self-sacrificing individuals touch and
- 11 enhance the lives of others on Make a Difference Day by giving
- 12 where there is a need, rebuilding what has been torn down,
- 13 teaching where there is a desire to learn and inspiring those
- 14 who have lost hope; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Since the inaugural Make a Difference Day in 1992,
- 2 USA Weekend Magazine and its affiliate newspapers and the Points
- 3 of Light Foundation and its affiliate volunteer centers have
- 4 joined to promote an annual national day of doing good that
- 5 celebrates and strengthens the spirit of volunteer service; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Volunteer service is an investment in the future
- 7 that we all must share; therefore be it
- 8 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate October
- 9 26, 2013, as "Make a Difference Day" in Pennsylvania; and be it
