1 2 3	Recognizing ChildFirst PA for its commitment to training members of multidisciplinary investigative teams and nationally recognized child abuse forensic interview training program in
4	Pennsylvania.
5	WHEREAS, Children bring happiness into our lives and hope to
6	our future; and
7	WHEREAS, Children are our greatest resource and our most
8	important responsibility; and
9	WHEREAS, It is our responsibility as parents, friends,
10	neighbors, citizens and lawmakers to nurture and protect
11	children, providing an atmosphere of love and respect in which
12	they are able to grow into healthy, well-adjusted and productive
13	adults; and
14	WHEREAS, We, as a legislative body, have an ongoing
15	commitment to protect the rights and needs of children; and
16	WHEREAS, Child abuse crosses all racial, economic and
17	geographic boundaries and has reached epidemic proportions

1 across this nation and throughout this Commonwealth; and 2 WHEREAS, There were 26,664 cases of possible child abuse or 3 maltreatment referred for investigation in this Commonwealth in 4 2012; and

5 WHEREAS, There were 3,565 substantiated cases of child abuse 6 and neglect in this Commonwealth in 2012; and

7 WHEREAS, Thousands of Pennsylvanians in schools, social 8 service agencies, churches and neighborhood groups throughout 9 this Commonwealth are working hard to nurture and support the 10 victims of child abuse and prevent future abuse; and 11 WHEREAS, In spite of the dedication and sacrifice of these individuals, much more still needs to be done to quarantee a 12 13 childhood free of abuse and victimization to every child in this Commonwealth; and 14

WHEREAS, As a legislative body, we acknowledge that each 15 county is required by the Child Protective Services Law to form 16 and operate a multidisciplinary investigative team (MDIT); and 17 18 WHEREAS, ChildFirst is a nationally recognized forensic interview training program developed by the National Child 19 20 Protection and Training Center (NCPTC) and Cornerhouse; and 21 WHEREAS, In July 2009, the Pennsylvania Children and Youth Solicitors Association applied to bring ChildFirst to 22 23 Pennsylvania; and

24 WHEREAS, ChildFirst PA is sponsored by the Pennsylvania 25 Children and Youth Solicitors Association in collaboration with 26 the Pennsylvania District Attorneys Association and the 27 Pennsylvania State Police; and

28 WHEREAS, In March 2011, Pennsylvania became the 17th29 ChildFirst state; and

30 WHEREAS, On December 12, 2011, House Resolution 522 of

Session 2011 was passed, directing the formation of the
Governor's Task Force on Child Protection to review the current
child abuse-related statutes and to make recommendations on how
to improve the child abuse system; and

5 WHEREAS, On November 27, 2012, the Governor's Task Force on 6 Child Protection submitted its report of more than 400 pages to 7 the Governor; and

8 WHEREAS, The Governor's Task Force on Child Protection 9 acknowledged the need to have well-trained forensic interviewers 10 who are prepared to interview a child alleged to be a victim of 11 abuse in an age-appropriate and developmentally appropriate 12 manner; and

13 WHEREAS, The Governor's Task Force on Child Protection 14 acknowledges the need for fully trained and functional MDITs in 15 each county across this Commonwealth; and

16 WHEREAS, ChildFirst PA has trained more than 28 of 17 Pennsylvania's 67 counties and more than 300 professionals 18 charged with the responsibility of investigating suspected child 19 abuse; and

20 WHEREAS, ChildFirst PA is anchored at the Pennsylvania State 21 Police Academy and training centers across this Commonwealth; 22 and

23 WHEREAS, The ChildFirst PA motto should be considered at all 24 times during a child abuse investigation and prosecution:

25 "The Child is our first priority.

26 It is not the needs of the family.

27 Not the child's 'story.'

28 Not the evidence.

29 Not the needs of the courts.

30 Not the needs of the police, Children and Youth

1 Services or attorneys. 2 The Child is our priority." 3 ; and 4 WHEREAS, ChildFirst PA is the only nationally recognized 5 forensic interview and MDIT training program in this Commonwealth; therefore be it 6 7 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate 8 ChildFirst PA as a recognized forensic interview training 9 program and MDIT; and be it further 10 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives continue to do its part in support of the training done by ChildFirst PA; and 11 12 be it further 13 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives commend the 14 Pennsylvania Children and Youth Solicitors Association, Pennsylvania District Attorneys Association, Pennsylvania State 15 Police, ChildFirst PA and all of its faculty who train the 16

17 forensic interviewers and professional members of the 18 multidisciplinary investigative teams to investigate suspected 19 child abuse.
