A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing the week of January 13 through 19, 2013, as "Emerald View Park Trail Week" in this Commonwealth to honor Mount 2
- Washington Community Development Corporation's Emerald View
- Park Program for demonstrating how people in a community can 4
- work together to improve the quality of life in their 5
- neighborhoods.
- 7 WHEREAS, Citizens, community members and lawmakers in this
- Commonwealth have the responsibility to preserve, nurture and 8
- 9 protect our environment; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Community development fosters safer and more livable
- neighborhoods, which creates a higher demand for real estate and 11
- attracts people as well as small businesses; and 12
- 13 WHEREAS, Intersecting problems and hyper-localizing capital
- 14 solves multiple neighborhood issues; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The Mount Washington and Duquesne Heights
- 16 neighborhoods of Pittsburgh saw the potential in their
- underutilized community parks and greenways and attempted to 17
- 18 capture that value through the creation of the Emerald View

- 1 Park; and
- 2 WHEREAS, The ultimate goal of the project is to create and
- 3 connect 20 miles of trail, encircling the two communities and
- 4 connecting the historical parks of Grandview, Olympia and
- 5 Dilworth with the Duquesne Heights Greenway; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Those involved in the Emerald View Park project as
- 7 volunteers or otherwise have removed 250,000 pounds of waste,
- 8 which created approximately six miles of new trails and
- 9 refurbished another four miles of the community that had dated
- 10 back to the 1930s; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The Emerald View Park Trail Corps program offers a
- 12 unique opportunity for employment by training workers in a very
- 13 unique skill set for trail construction and conservation in
- 14 difficult terrain where machinery cannot be used and it pays its
- 15 workers a living wage with benefits; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The park has become a marguee location in the
- 17 community, as seen in the increased sale prices of nearby
- 18 houses, the opening of new businesses in the community and as
- 19 demonstrated by the recognition of the Mount Washington
- 20 Community Development Corporation as a Champion in Action in the
- 21 neighborhood revitalization category by Citizens Bank and
- 22 program partners WPXI-TV, Trib Total Media and Pittsburgh Cares
- 23 for all the collaborative and other work in the park's
- 24 development; therefore be it
- 25 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 26 week of January 13 through 19, 2013, as "Emerald View Park Trail
- 27 Week" to honor and recognize Mount Washington Community
- 28 Development Corporation's Emerald View Park Program for
- 29 demonstrating how people in a community can work together to
- 30 improve the quality of life in their neighborhoods; and be it
