A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing the 175th birthday of Clinton County, Pennsylvania.

2 WHEREAS, On June 21, 1839, Clinton County was created from
3 parts of Centre and Lycoming Counties, and the county seat is
4 Lock Haven; and

5 WHEREAS, It was first named Eagle County; and

6 WHEREAS, Later, it was named in honor of the seventh Governor
7 of New York State, DeWitt Clinton; and

8 WHEREAS, Clinton County is at the heart of the Pennsylvania
9 Wilds located along the Susquehanna River; and

10 WHEREAS, Piper Aircraft was one of the area's largest
11 employers and the Piper Museum remains one of the largest
12 attractions with an annual fly-in; and

13 WHEREAS, The area is proud of its foliage and celebrates
14 nature and the beautiful fall colors at the Flaming Foliage
15 Festival; and

16 WHEREAS, The Megatransect is a hike and trail run in excess
17 of 26 miles through the county that has grown to one of the

1 largest trail events in the United States; and

2 WHEREAS, For 43 years the Jaycees have sponsored a Regatta on
3 Labor Day weekend to close out the summer, and racers from the
4 American Powerboat Association come from all over the world to
5 participate in the largest boat race of its kind on the east
6 coast; and

7 WHEREAS, Since 1972 the Clinton County Fair has given the
8 residents a place to showcase and enjoy 4-H and agricultural
9 exhibits; and

10 WHEREAS, It is home to one of our 14 State universities, Lock
11 Haven University, educating and preparing students for the
12 future; and

13 WHEREAS, Clinton County is the home of the Keystone Mid-
14 Atlantic champions of the 2011 Little League World Series;
15 therefore be it

16 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize and
17 congratulate Clinton County on its 175th birthday; and be it
