## A RESOLUTION

- Designating February 17, 2014, as "Presidents' Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Observance of Presidents' Day in Pennsylvania serves
- 4 to celebrate the birthday of George Washington and to honor all
- 5 the Presidents of the United States; and
- 6 WHEREAS, George Washington was born on February 22, 1732; and
- 7 WHEREAS, George Washington's birthday is a Federal holiday
- 8 celebrated annually on the third Monday of February; and
- 9 WHEREAS, George Washington was the first President of the
- 10 United States; and
- 11 WHEREAS, George Washington served two terms as President of
- 12 the United States, from 1789 to 1793 and 1793 to 1797; and
- 13 WHEREAS, While President of the United States, George
- 14 Washington led the American Continental Army to victory over the

- 1 British in 1783; and
- 2 WHEREAS, George Washington has been recognized as the "father
- 3 of this country"; and
- 4 WHEREAS, George Washington resided over the convention that
- 5 drafted the United States Constitution, which replaced the
- 6 Articles of the Confederation; and
- 7 WHEREAS, George Washington was lauded for his leadership,
- 8 ability to encourage and boost the morale of the military,
- 9 ability to develop a good relationship with Congress and
- 10 precision regarding all aspects of the war effort; therefore be

- 13 February 17, 2014, as "Presidents' Day" in Pennsylvania.
