A RESOLUTION

1 2 3	Memorializing the Governor to take certain actions relating to the year-round capacity of the City of New York-owned reservoirs affecting the Delaware River Basin.
4	WHEREAS, The Delaware River is the eastern border of Bucks
5	County in this Commonwealth; and
6	WHEREAS, The Delaware River has a history of flood events
7	which have endangered human life and property, damaged public
8	infrastructure and disrupted the conduct of business in Bucks
9	County; and
10	WHEREAS, In 2007, Bucks County empaneled a Delaware River
11	Flood Task Force to study the flood events from 2004 through
12	2006, and to make findings and recommendations to reduce the
13	impact of flooding on Bucks County's river communities; and
14	WHEREAS, Based on two years of study, analysis and review of
15	published reports, the task force concluded that establishing
16	year-round voids in New York City reservoirs would beneficially
17	affect Bucks County flood levels and reduce the number of

1 flooded properties and the extent of flooding; and 2 WHEREAS, The Delaware River Basin Commission through its 3 Flood Analysis Model (2010) issued a report indicating that reservoir voids would reduce flooding in Bucks County; and 4 WHEREAS, Management of the flows and levels of reservoirs 5 6 owned by the City of New York is subject to the United States 7 Supreme Court Decree of 1954 (Decree of 1954); and 8 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, the State of Delaware, the State of New Jersey, the State of New York and the 9 10 City of New York are parties to the Decree of 1954; and 11 WHEREAS, The Decree of 1954 provides that the City of New York may fill its reservoirs to 105% capacity from the period of 12 13 May 1 through June 15 of each year, a period when flooding has 14 historically occurred; and

15 WHEREAS, When its reservoirs are filled beyond their 16 capacities, the City of New York is unable to provide any flood control downstream of the reservoirs during significant rain 17 18 events, thereby presenting an unnecessary and dangerous threat 19 to the lives and properties of Bucks County residents; and 20 WHEREAS, Each of the four states has standing to call upon the United States Supreme Court to amend the Decree of 1954 to 21 require that the City of New York maintain the levels in its 22 23 Delaware River Basin reservoirs at or below 90% during all 24 periods of the year, thereby providing reasonable flood mitigation capability to protect those who are downstream of the 25 reservoirs; and 26

27 WHEREAS, PPL Electric Utilities, which owns Lake 28 Wallenpaupack in northeastern Pennsylvania, has voluntarily 29 lowered its lake levels; and

30 WHEREAS, The Delaware River Basin Commission has been

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1 requested to assist downstream residents and businesses with

2 lowering other reservoir levels; and

3 WHEREAS, The agreement of the parties to the Decree of 19544 has not been attained; therefore be it

5 RESOLVED, That the Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania call upon the Governors of the State of Delaware, 6 7 the State of New Jersey and the State of New York to address 8 matters regarding the management of reservoirs belonging to the City of New York and to petition the United States Supreme Court 9 to amend the Decree of 1954 to compel the City of New York to 10 limit water levels in reservoirs under its jurisdiction at or 11 below a level of 90% at all times of the year in order to 12 13 provide adequate voids to mitigate flooding conditions that 14 endanger the lives and properties of the citizens of Bucks 15 County; and be it further

16 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to 17 the Governor of the State of Delaware, the Governor of the State 18 of New Jersey, the Governor of the State of New York, the Mayor 19 of the City of New York, the Pennsylvania congressional 20 delegation and the Delaware, New Jersey and New York 21 congressional delegations.

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
