A RESOLUTION

1 Designating the week of April 20 through 26, 2014, as
2 "Administrative Professionals' Week" and designating April
3 23, 2014, as "Administrative Professionals' Day" in
4 Pennsylvania.

5 WHEREAS, Administrative professionals play an essential role
6 in coordinating the office operations of businesses, government
7 offices, educational institutions and other organizations; and

8 WHEREAS, The work of administrative professionals today
9 requires advanced knowledge and expertise in communications,
10 computer software, office technology, project management,
11 organization, customer service and other vital office management
12 responsibilities; and

13 WHEREAS, Administrative Professionals' Week is observed
14 annually in workplaces around the world to recognize the
15 important contributions of administrative support staff and is
16 sponsored by the International Association of Administrative

1 Professionals; and

2 WHEREAS, Administrative Professionals' Week in 2014 is
3 focused on honoring the office professionals who make offices
4 run effectively and reflecting the integral and central role
5 that office professionals play; therefore be it

6 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate April
7 20 through 26, 2014, as "Administrative Professionals' Week" and
8 April 23, 2014, as "Administrative Professionals' Day" in
9 Pennsylvania; and be it further

10 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives encourage all
11 businesses, government offices, educational institutions and
12 other organizations to support continued training and
13 development for administrative staff and recognize that a well-
14 trained workforce is essential for success in today's world.
